#### From I-75 South:



n New Year's Day, 1929, Georgia Tech played UCLA in the Rose Bowl, a game made famous by Roy Riegels who recovered a fumble and ran sixty-five yards in the wrong direction. One of his teammates ran him down and tackled him just before he scored for the opposing team. During halftime, Coach Price said little except to say, "Men, the

same team that played the first half will start the second." The players got up and started out, all but Riegels. The coach looked back and called to him. Riegels didn't move. Coach Price went over to where Riegels sat and said, "Roy, didn't you hear me?" Roy looked up, with tears in his eyes. "Coach," he said, "I can't do it. It's over."

Most people have run the wrong direction at some time. We get turned around. We lose our bearing. We may even get caught in the process. It is a common experience. We may even feel that 'it's over.' But with God, it's never over. God is the God of second chances. Lamentations 3:21-23 reads "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." As your calendar turns to a new year, give some thought to what direction you are headed. Is it the right direction? However you answer, just know that God's mercies for you never end.

Wise Gifts

Reflecting on gifts I have received over the years I am amazed at how many of them were appropriate to what I needed at the time. Some of them were clothing, others games, toys, cash, or time spent on trips. Whereas I never received an "ugly sweater," I've recognized that better than the gift itself was/is the heart of the giver, even if the gift was not what I was expecting.







## **GRATITUDE**

uch has been written about the habits it takes to be a highly effective person. But what are the habits of a highly effective Christian? This article is the first of seven that puts basic Bible teaching in an easy to read format and provides us all with encouragement and direction on our walk with Jesus.

Habit 1: Be Thankful

"In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus"

— I Thessalonians 5:18

We're talking about growing into an attitude of gratitude! What does giving thanks in "everything" mean for daily living? Did you notice the Bible does not say "be thankful *because* of everything" but "in everything." We don't thank God for our health problems like "I've got chronic pain, thanks God." But we can say "Thank you God for being with me in my chronic pain." With our eyes wide-open and searching for reasons to express thanks to God, our brains become rewired to accentuate the positive in life—the big things and the small things, the obvious and the not so obvious.

Try this: each day as you wake up or when you lie down at night, relax and pause. Be still and become aware of your breathing. Then, become aware of what brings you joy. What are you glad for? This doesn't need to be a long period. Start with five minutes a day, every day.



A Hawaiian Luau at Zoar? What's with that? Longtime Zoar member Lynn Cooper was raised with her siblings in Kailua, Hawaii. She describes it as a sleepy beach town often listed on the Top Ten Best Beaches of the USA, where

she spent many hours boogie boarding the beaches of O'ahu. She remembers President Obama as a fellow student (a few years older) on the campus of Punahou School (K-12). Lynn graduated from Miami University of Ohio and lived in Boston following graduation. She and husband, Dr. Chris Cooper, moved to the Toledo area in the summer of 1994 as they were



expecting their first of four children (Emily, Katherine, Johnathan and Peter) and immediately joined Zoar.

The Cooper family has volunteered and participated in many Zoar activities. For the past four years, they have partnered with the Scott & Judy Loehrke family (Allison, Abby, Lynne, Anna) to host and serve the Thanksgiving dinner at Zoar provided by Bob Evans. Through this event, Lynn became more familiar with the hunger issues confronting those in our community. This awareness led her to spearhead a fundraiser for the PCU Food Bank, at a time of year when supplies often run low.

Reaching to her Hawaiian roots, Lynn put together elements of a Hawaiian Luau as a fundraiser and adult fellowship event. The dinner, underwritten by the Zoar Foundation, includes many authentic Hawaiian dishes. Beautiful fresh flower leis will arrive with Lynn's mother, Lorrie Maland who will visit from Hawaii for the occasion. Lorrie participates in two types of hula: Hula Kahiko and Hula Auana (ancient and modern). She works on occasion for the Pacific Islands Institute, which takes older adults on tours of the Hawaiian Islands and Fiji. Lorrie will share a hula dance at the luau, as well as teach one to female guests.
