#### It's all about Jesus

Just listen to your calendar on the last day of October, and you will hear, "A mighty fortress is our God!" On October 31, just 500 years ago, Dr. Martin Luther posted 95 statements for discussion (the 95 Theses) on the Church bulletin Board (the front door) for discussion. The Reformation had begun.

The presenting problem for Martin was that the Church in his day was offering people a way to pay to get out of purgatory. Yet Martin's whole heart reading of Scripture, told him that only in Jesus is there



salvation, hope, and life.

For Dr. Luther the work of God in Jesus on the cross from the empty tomb completed the work of salvation. Nothing more needs to be done. God is grace, and that "underserved love of God for us" is the way God works in the world. We cannot do anything to "earn" God's love. It is freely given, purchased with a great cost, granted out of God's fully loving heart. It's all about Jesus.

Today we rejoice that many of the divisions between the Lutherans and Roman Catholics have been resolved, the key issue being that we are justified

by grace through faith and Reformed onto this document of yet. The Church needs the separation of the supremacy, the the have-nots, the uncharitable actions so forth. We have a

toward non-Christians, and message of grace and love

for all, because we have been given grace and love, freely.

So, how about you? The good news of God's love in Jesus is freely given to you, to offer you healing and restoration of relationships. In the midst of all that you are, Jesus comes with arms wide open, with fullness of love. And it is this good news that our world desperately needs to hear from us. Only in God's love through Jesus will this world of division and suspicion find peace, and hope, and community.

This 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary really takes us back farther, to the cross and grace, and back to creation, and beyond that to the heart of God. May this anniversary spark in us such love that the world may know that it really is "all about Jesus."

### THE EYES SAY IT ALL

**Zoar Makes Quilts for Mission**

he Lutheran World Relief quilt ministry at Zoar has been active since its inception in 1945 when women around the country collected quilts for fellow Lutherans living in post-WWII Europe. By the 1960s, Lutheran World Relief expanded their mission from serving the needs of those in Europe, to working in agriculture and food security in the developing world. Eventually the ministry included emergency and disaster relief in areas with widespread devastation, as well as longer-term relief and recovery efforts around the world.

It is impossible to know how many quilts from Zoar Lutheran have been added to these relief efforts in the past 72 years, but on October 22, almost 200 quilts completed in 2017 alone, will be packed for shipment. Zoar congregation acknowledges the efforts of the "Quilt Ladies" in a special Global Church Weekend that includes a blessing of the quilts during church services on

Oct 21 & 22. When the colorful array of bed-sized blankets are packed, a shipping barcode is applied to the box, allowing the group to know where their quilts have traveled in the world. First and foremost, recipients use their LWR quilts to shield against the cold and rain, and for warm bedding. But their versatility also makes quilts useful as simple tents, floor coverings, or a wrap to hold a baby on a mother's back. "There is, indeed, a transforming moment when a quilt passes from our hands into another's, and they embrace it," comments Kirk Betts upon distributing LWR quilts in Niger. Fabric is donated by members and friends of Zoar, then cut and sewn by individual members of the quilt group. Assembling the quilts, tying tops, bottoms and adding a warm layer of batting, is done by the group several times per month.

A Home-style Meal for All Starts 13th Year




