From I-75 South:





The host will provide the main course and each two people attending will provide either a vegetable, salad, or desert dish for just that table using family style serving.

We have been called to serve our neighbors as a reflection of the love Christ has for us. Our Feed Your Neighbor program continues to serve a week's worth of groceries and other personal care items twice a month. We have already served 596 new families/households this year and will serve close to 8000 individuals, nearly 25% of them children and youth, by the close of 2016. Redeemer's food pantry has become

independent and selfsupporting after Toledo Area Ministries (TAM) ceased to be a viable partner in 2015.

WE ARE BOOMING WITH KIDS!

Our Summer Youth Program served 68 children averaging a daily attendance of 40-45 over the course of 8 weeks from June until August. You can see a video of our Summer Youth Program posted on Zoar's Facebook page and website or go to Youtube.com and enter SYP 2016 and look for the kids holding the parachute. Redeemer's after school program, Art & Soul, is an extension of the Summer Youth Program serving kids ages 4-14 (preK-8) with individual homework help, snack, an artistic activity (music, drama, crafts, art, dance, etc), computer time, supper and faith formation Monday through Thursday from 4 to 6:30 pm. We are BOOMING with kids. What was begun in the fall of 2012 has grown from an average of 6 kids with 15 registered to an average of 19 kids daily with 24 registered. We are grateful to Zoar member Leigh Ann Meinecke who had been a faithful volunteer but became a Redeemer staff member in Spring of 2016 –taking on the role of Youth Outreach Minister. We still need volunteers to help meet this growth in our program. Kids attending have increased their grades, learned better problem solving techniques and strengthened computer skills as well as study habits.

We are always open to having folks come and participate and experience the Kingdom community God has set in motion here at Redeemer – join us for worship at 10:30 am or come volunteer at our After School program once a week – or at the Redeemer Feed Your

Neighbor food pantry once a month. If you have never experienced economic poverty – it will open your eyes to the reality of over one quarter of the American population. If you are interested in strengthening the educational system or have an art, musical gift, interest in drama/theatre or just want to help with homework – come join us in making a difference one child at a time.
