C ometimes the season of Advent • can have a jarring effect on folks. We have just finished the warmth of Thanksgiving dinner and parades and football. Children are already practicing the Christmas pageant, and the choir is working on a concert and calendars are parties and such. At home we're getting decorations out and putting up the tree and getting the cards signed and sent

And then we come into worship and



the lector gets up and the words we hear during this warm and cozy season are: "O that you would tear open the heavens and come down," and more about things like mountains quaking and water boiling. We think, "Well, that's a prophet, that's the 'Old Testament.' What do you expect? Wait for the Gospel." ast month Kate and I were able to go to her brother's wedding where our three children and spouses and grandchildren (Addison at 4th grade, Juniper at 6 months, and Milan 9 weeks old) were with us for several days. It was great to be with family, and awesome to see how well our kids are as parents! I also was again aware of the amount of "stuff" that accompanies a young one stuff to keep them safe, warm, and clean.

Not to connect my grandchildren with the Holy Babe, but Christmas is upon us. We know the story: the young, pregnant, (by divine means) engaged woman and her possibly older fiancé travel

In Him is all the hope for those who are cast off, or alone, or grieving. In him no one needs to be afraid (even in our present days!). In Him all our sins and brokenness have been nailed to the cross, buried in the tomb, raised from the dead. In him is life, life for me.

This year, when you come to the gift of Christmas, look at the Child, and be amazed. He has come for you. He has come because of God's love for you – forever! And with those small hands God embraces the whole world. Thank you, Jesus!



It might feel odd to think of the weeks before Christmas as something more than Christmastime. But many people have found the tradition of Advent a very effective practice to help keep perspective. Advent helps us get ready, not for a present-opening party, but for a transformational celebration of the birth of Jesus.

Join with Christians around the world in counting down the Sundays to the birth of Jesus Christ. Consider getting an Advent wreath for your home.

Placing it a prominent place in your home and lighting the candles with everyone in your house.
