magine pulling \$5 dollars out of vour pocket to loan to a single mother in Peru to buy chickens to produce eggs to feed her children and sell at market? Or, you loan a struggling farmer in Cameroon a small amount to purchase more Cornelia in her backyard with her chickens. seed for his garden to produce enough to feed his family and have enough to take to market to sell for school supplies. That is precisely what Zoar's Social Ministry Committee does each month at its regular meeting. Each meeting begins by collecting an offering that is then used to help change people's lives around the world through what are known as microloans. Brokered through KIVA (see KIVA.org), these small loans to individuals living in developing countries help people rise above poverty. The loans are made with no interest to the borrower for amounts as low as \$25 for such items as garden seeds, farm animals for small scale food production, building materials for home improvement, educational tuition and supplies, and thousands more. Each month, committee members hear a report about the individuals whose lives have been changed by the small loans they made possible. 

#### Give up...give in...give?

Oh, no, l've started another program where I have to give something up! For some of us the "thing" we have to send away might be types/ amounts of food, or various activities, or how we spend our time. Some of us may need to actually stop those things that harm us or others. Self-discipline, denial, and delayed gratification are difficult in our culture and time.

Then we come to Lent. Beginning March 1, these 40 days help us prepare for Jesus' washing the feet of the disciple and



giving the bread/wine, Jesus taking the cross on our behalf, and Jesus rising from the tomb. 40 days (if you count them, remember that Sunday, the remembrance of *Resurrection*, are not included in the 40, but you still will not hear "alleluia" on Sundays!)

Many "give something up" during this time, like sweets, or meat, or Diet Coke. This may be helpful for you to get ready for Easter, but let's go deeper.

The Ash Wednesday "charge" is for us to walk these days in prayer, fasting, and giving of our offering. As you will hear on Ash Wednesday, that charge is also for us to do these actions in secret, not receiving praise from others. So let me offer you some thoughts as you plan to enter this Lenten journey:

- Instead of give up, give. Give of your time to a neighbor, or hospice, or a shelter. Give of your time to spend dedicated moments reading the Bible, or in prayer, or exploring Luther's Catechism. Give of your offering in ways that support God's mission. Give of your time to pass on the joy of Jesus.
- Explore giving something up. Take a meal time, or a day, and fast. Spend this fasting time in prayer, taking the money you would have used and give it away. Maybe even use this time to permanently give up something harmful. And, choose to forgive.
- ✤ Fast from electronics. (Wow!) Unplug yourself for a period from mass and social media, and spend that time in prayer.
- Make worship and "church" a priority, as together we serve each other.
- ✤ Follow my "40 Days of Tweets" @tphilabaum
- ✤ Above all, give up the self-doubt and self-hate, and hurt, and give into the truth that you are loved by the Loving God. Together we walk to the Cross and God's love.

The Social Ministry Committee has selected the Summer Youth Program at **Redeemer Lutheran Church** as the recipient of our donations and offerings from special Lenten donations at Sunday School and Wednesday Lenten meals. # **7 HABITS OF HIGHLY EFFECTIVE ZOAR** DISCIPLES

#### 3. Contentment

e live in a world of obsession with material possessions. **V** Far too many of us find ourselves in debt because we've been swept up in the frenzy of accumulation. In our consumerist society, it is difficult to distinguish between our needs and our wants and desires. We often believe that the more money we have, the happier we will be. There's an interesting paradox when we finally recognize that nothing we have really belongs to us. Even though we have many things, none of them actually belongs to us.

As we come to understand that everything belongs to God, our perspective changes...we become more content. "Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, ..." (Hebrews 13:5). A Zoar disciple learns contentment through the knowledge that God will provide everything that is needed. We

wrestle with the question, "How much is enough?" most of our lives. What is the limit? As Christians, we need to actively seek God's guidance to help us continually differentiate between our real needs, and our wants and desires. Accept God's provision in your life, and find contentment in the source, not the supply. (I Timothy 6: 6-8).

## remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return WEDNESDAYS DURING LENT

The post-Ash Wednesdays in Lent will be a time during which we will focus in on Luther's Small Catechism. Since this year is the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation, we will use this Lenten time to grow deeper in the key elements of our faith. You are welcome to pick up a booklet entitled, *Free Indeed: Devotions for Lent 2017*. This resource is a daily devotional for Lent based on the Small Catechism. The schedule changes for these next 5 Wednesdays. There will be an **11am Worship Service, and a 6:30pm Service**. Both of these will be held in the Family Life Center. During that hour we will eat together a simple meal of soup and bread, hear the word and proclamation, and spend some time in discussion at our table. So the totality of meal and service will be held at the tables in the FLC during these times. The schedule includes:

> March 8 – the Ten Commandments March 15 – The Lord's Prayer March 22 – The Apostle's Creed March 29 – Holy Baptism April 5 – Holy Communion
