NOURISH YOUR SOUL

hen your emotional tank is empty, it's hard to keep giving love to people. Instead, you get overwhelmed and start to feel inadequate. You dream of getting away. David had this problem. He said, *"If only I had* wings like a dove — I would fly away and find



rest" (Psalm 55:6 GW). To keep on loving people, you have to keep your emotional tank full, because when it gets low, it's going to make a difference in your relationships. The Bible has three suggestions for recharging emotionally:

Solitude. You need time alone. Jesus frequently withdrew from crowds when he needed to recharge himself emotionally. Sometimes there was so much hustle and bustle that Jesus told the disciples to "come apart" for a while (Mark 6:31 KJV). You either come apart or you will *come apart*. You need times of solitude. 2) **Recreation.** There are certain things that recreate energy and enthusiasm for life. For you it may be hobbies, a sport, a craft, or games. Experiment, find out what recharges you emotionally, and

love to sing, and I love singing hymns. At each season of the Church Year we sing out our faith through hymns, both ancient and modern. Hymns and hymn-tunes tie us into the faith of generations before us, as well as into the breadth of other Christians singing today.

And to make it even better, this is the season of Easter - Alleluia! These songs and hymns must have jumped out of the Tomb with Jesus. Together we sing of God's glory, that God in Jesus has conquered death.

Also, this is the 500th Year of the beginning of the



Lutheran Reformation. Martin himself enlarged the role of hymns in worship, especially songs in the language of the people. He played the lute and sang throughout his life, expressing his faith through the gift of music.

So, I love to sing hymns. And I love the way our songs and music both speak to the needs in our soul, as well as lift our hearts up to our loving God!

There are two hymns writers that we hold onto on our May "Saint" calendar. On the 9th we remember Count von Zinzendorf, a German-Lutheran by birth, who moved to early America, leading the Moravians. The song we sing, "Jesus, Still Lead On," speaks of trust in God's guidance in times of struggle and in times of joy. The other hymn writer is Juri Tranovsky, who died in 1637 in Slovakia. In his kyrie-style hymn, "O God, Father in Heaven," we cry out to






Mother's Day-May 14th

ne of the great false teachings about the Christian life is that once you've become a Christian suddenly all your problems go away. If there is one thing that Jesus' death on the cross makes abundantly clear it is that God's chosen ones suffer. Problems don't magically go away when we walk with Jesus. Jesus says "In this world you will have trouble" (John 16:33). God doesn't do magic. God does perform miracles, though, large and small, quick and long-in-the-making. Jesus' resurrection is God's dramatic statement on the reality of miracles. So, go ahead and ask. Seek. Knock.



DEAR PAR

An Open Letter (reprinted with permission),

You are doing something really, *really* important. I know it's not easy. I see you with your arms overflowing, and I know you came to church already tired. Parenting is tiring. Really tiring.

I watch you bounce and sway trying to keep the baby quiet, juggling the infant car seat and the diaper bag as you find a seat. I see you wince as your child cries. I see you anxiously pull things out of your bag of tricks to try to quiet them.

And I see you with your toddler and your preschooler. I watch you cringe when your little girl asks an innocent question in a voice that might not be an inside voice let alone a church whisper. I hear the exasperation in your voice as you *beg* your child to just sit, to be quiet as you




feel everyone's eyes on you. Not everyone is looking, but I know it feels that way.

I know you're wondering, is this worth it? Why do I bother? I know you often leave church

more exhausted than fulfilled. But what you are doing is *so* important.

When you are here, the church is filled with a joyful noise. When you are here, the Body of Christ is more fully present. When you are here, we are reminded that this worship thing we do isn't about bible study or personal, quiet contemplation but coming together to worship as a community where all are welcome, where we share in the Word and Sacrament together. When you are here, I have hope that these pews won't be empty in 10 years when your kids are old enough to *sit quietly and behave in Cont'd pg. 8*




NEW NANA GROUP

worship. I know that they are learning how and why we worship now, before it's too late. They are learning that worship is important.

I see them learning. In the midst of the cries, whines, and giggles, in the midst of the crinkling of pretzel bags and the growing pile of crumbs, I see a little girl who insists on going two pews up to share peace with someone she's never met. I hear a little boy slurping (quite loudly) every last drop of his communion wine out of the cup, determined not to miss a drop of Jesus. I watch a child excitedly color a cross and point to the one in the front of the sanctuary. I hear the echos of "Amens" just a few seconds after the rest of the community says it together. I watch a boy just learning



to read try to sound out the words in the worship book or count his way to Hymn 672. Even on weeks when I can't see my own children learning because, well, it's one of *those* mornings, I can see your children learning.

I know how hard it is to do what you're doing, but I want you to know *it matters*. It matters to me. It matters to my children to not be alone in the pew. It matters to the congregation to know that families care about faith, to see young people... and even on those weeks when you can't see the little moments, it matters to your children.

It matters that they learn that worship is what we do as a community of faith, that everyone is welcome, that *their* worship

matters. When we teach children that their worship matters, we teach them that they are *enough* right here and right now as members of the church

community. They don't need to wait until they can believe, pray or worship a certain way to be welcome here, and I know adults who are still looking to be shown that. It matters that children learn that they are an integral part of this church, that their prayers, their songs, and even their badly (or perfectly-timed, depending on who you ask) cries and whines *are* a joyful noise because it means they are present.

I know it's hard, but thank you for what you do when you bring your children to church. Please know that your family — with all of its noise, struggle, commotion, and joy — are not simply tolerated, you are a vital part of the community gathered in worship.


LITTLE JOB BIG IMPACT

FOUNDATION GRANT TO MATCH ABUNDANT LIFE

"With God All Things Are Possible!"

40 years ago Zoar founded Abundant Life of Perrysburg to provide a place and ministry for senior citizens on a fixed income. Still today the members of the Board are all Zoar members, and Zoar is blessed to be a part of the abundance of Abundant Life! Since the beginning, Abundant Life has been blessed to have a bus to transport residents to local shopping, various outings in Perrysburg and around northwest Ohio. The current bus is 20 years old and is experiencing many mechanical difficulties making it more and more unsafe to transport residents. Abundant Life is governed by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), which will not allow Abundant Life to use its own operation or reserve funds to purchase a new bus. However, HUD does allow the seeking of grants, donations, and fund raisers.

Thanks be to God! On April 6, 2017, the Zoar Foundation generously granted Abundant Life up to \$20,000.00 in matching funds to purchase a new (used) bus. An additional \$20,000 is needed for the new (used) bus. You are encouraged to be part of the continuing ministry at Abundant Life. The Staff and Board of Trustees are asking Zoar members to prayerfully consider making a donation to help us raise \$20,000.00 over the next few months. Any donations that Zoar members can contribute would be most appreci-

then make time for it. Matthew 11:9 says, *"The Son of Man came, enjoying life"* (Phillips translation). Jesus was the most intensive, ministry-oriented person that ever lived, but he enjoyed life. You need play time. 3) **Laughter.** *"Being cheerful keeps you healthy"* (Proverbs 17:22 TEV). Studies prove that when you laugh, it increases the number of T-cells, which raises your immunity level, which produces endorphins in your brain. Humor has beneficial effects! God has given us the gift of laughter, and we need to learn how to laugh. Laughter is a load lightener, an emotional recharger, and a love rebuilder.
