

Stewardship At the Center of Who We Are

t's been said that good stewardship is good worship. At its heart, stewardship is our joyful response to our extravagantly generous God. This year, Zoar will celebrate God's extravagance with a focus in worship called *Transformed by Grace, Faith, and Love*. Beginning this worship emphasis on October 1 and continuing on October 8 and 15,

addition to moving personal stories, each Sunday will focus on a different gift God gives to every believer. These are the gifts of grace, faith, and love. In bestowing on you these gifts, God appoints you as a steward, someone in charge of managing resources.

Transformed by Grace

In week one, our focus is on grace, which is God's undeserved kindness and goodness. God's grace comes to us freely in Jesus' love for us. It is not something to which we have a right. Grace moves us and prompts us to accept God's call to be stewards. Stewardship is our response to God's grace in Jesus Christ. From grateful and thankful hearts we use our time, talents, and money in ways that make God smile.

Transformed by Faith

In week two, we learn that grace comes to us through faith. Faith is the feeling of utter dependence on God. Through faith, God changes us and makes us part of his new creation. In faith, our lives take on new meaning. In faith, our lives go new directions. Faith gives shape to our works (James 2:18) and leads to concrete action. From our total dependence on God, we manage our time, talents, and money.

Transformed by Love

In week three, our focus is love. Love seeks the welfare of others. God's love in Christ will move us to do things that might seem daring. It is because of love that we, as God's children, go out on a limb to do Jesus' work. God's love prompts us to give freely of our time, talents, and treasures to help others and extend his kingdom.

Not Your Usual Sunday School Class





n a day and an age when it is common to hear reports of declining church attendance, declining membership, and aging church populations across the nation and in all denominations, Zoar stands out for moving in the opposite direction. A mid-year review of Zoar's worship attendance points to a very live and lively church.


From January through June of this year, weekly worship attendance was up 7.2% over the same period of January – June last year. In 2016, attendance at the weekend worship services averaged 411 people. In 2017, from January — June, average attendance at worship was 441 at weekend worship. Being a part of a growing dynamic church is a rare experience in America.

Rally Day Not Just for Kids Anymore



Directions

From I-75 South:

Take the US-20/US-23 exit (exit number 193) toward PERRYSBURG/FREMONT. Then Turn left onto N. Sandusky St. (US-23/US-20) Zoar is about a mile ahead on the right side of the road.

From I-75 North:

Merge onto Sandusky St/US-20 (exit number 193) toward PERRYSBURG/FORT MEIGS. Keep going straight. Zoar is about a mile ahead on the right side of the road.
