

ZOAR COUNCIL UPDATE

Preserving the Past for the Future

ast summer the Property Committee began the process of evaluating the condiition of the stained glass windows in the sanctuary. In November, the Property Committee submitted a request to council to hire Bigelow Glass of Findlay, Ohio, to evaluate the stained glass windows of the sanctuary and prepare a quote for the repair of the windows. At the April Council meeting, Gary Panzero presented the recommendation of the Property Committee explaining the findings about the windows, as well as the quote for repair of the windows. Last fall it was estimated that the cost of repairing the windows could be as high as \$85,000. The quote presented to council from Bigelow Glass was for \$70,000. This quote included a discount of \$8,000 if the work was completed during 2016. Tom Schult, our Treasurer, informed the council we have about \$67,000 in the major repair fund to cover the cost of this project. In keeping with past practice, the council determined this did not require a vote of the congregation. The additional funds needed to pay for the repairs will be borrowed from our surplus funds and will be paid back as new gifts are received. Therefore, in the interest of keeping the congregation informed of major council decisions, Ken Meineke shares this information that the council passed a motion to accept the bid from Bigelow Glass and hire them to complete the work in 2016. Because the project will take several weeks to complete, there will be some disruption of the sanctuary while the work is in progress. Our plan is to have the work completed by early fall, and we ask for your patience and support as we work to protect the future of our stained glass win-

dows. As always, we appreciate your continued support of the major repair fund, and if you would like to contribute specifically to this project loved one, please fice.
