WHAT HAPPENS ON OCTOBER 32ND?

Once we have reached November, we have passed the remembrances of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. It is so important to our history, and yet even better are the ways that Christians who once fought are gathering together to witness to the glory and presence of Jesus.

One of the leaders in the ELCA once quipped, "so what happens on October 32nd?" When I first heard this my mind got stuck on the reality that there is no 32nd. But as she talked, her concern focused on what happens now, the "day after the Reformation," as we move into the future.

I have become convinced that we (Lutherans) really like them (the Roman Catholics, the Episcopalians, the Methodist, the Evangelicals, etc). We have become good friends, and we like doing things with them. But as I read John 17:20-24 (you may look it up – I know you have



a Bible!) I see that the prayer of Jesus is not just that we be "friends" with Christians of other denominations, but that we "date," and someday even "get married!" The day will come when Jesus returns, and in God's eternal Kingdom there will not be "Lutheran" tables or "Methodist rooms" or "Roman Catholic parties," but all together we will be, giving our common and joyous praise. So, if that's the goal, then that's what I think we still need to work toward. Tough task ahead, but I believe the Holy Spirit is leading us toward that goal.

A "great cloud of witnesses" have gone before us, those who have taught us of God's love, and how God's love reaches to all people. Many of them we will remember on the 1st weekend of November, giving thanks for all the

saints in Jesus. In addition a great gathering of men and women gave of themselves on behalf of freedom and democracy, so on Veterans' Day we give thanks for their witness. Then, on the 23rd, we pause to give praise to our awesome God, who has blessed us and this land and this with bountiful gifts and abundant love.

November. As with two heads, one looking back at those who have gone before us, and the other looking ahead at what God has in store for us together, we stand in grace. The One who created and blessed us, the One who died and then rose from the dead, the One who moves in our midst pushing us into God's future is The One God to whom we witness.

May we grow even stronger in the ways of God, so that the world may know the healing grace of God through our words, our deeds, our forgiveness, our peace making. May the world see the Church of Jesus as "one," and the love of all of God's people shared indiscriminately. And, may Jesus come soon! Amen!

These songs -ELW 808 and 637- spoke to her in her final weeks and days, and by having us sing them, she testified to us

about the power of music and of inspired devotional texts, about the nature of communal testimony, and about death and resurrection. We will miss Jan, but her memory will live on in her witness to us.

As we go through November, leaves will fall, and nature will enact its own form of death. I pray that we can be as confident and faithful in our witness as we are sure that spring will return.
