

Happy Mother's Day! So many things come to my mind on this day: my prayers abound for those of you who have children (of any age). The calling you have to be mother is one of the best vocations that God has given us; to those of you who would like children, or those of you who have lost children, we sit with you in grief and silence, knowing that our loving God holds on to you with grace and hope. I also know of several dads who now are alone, called to care for their child with fatherly and motherly nurture and guidance. God is with you too! And to each of you, all with mothers: some are blessed with mothers who brought nurture and care; others struggle with issues your mother may have brought to your life. Know also that we surround you with God's



amazing arms of grace and healing love!

It's now been over a year since my mother died. We were very blessed that her time of dying was short, and that she knew she was surrounded by the family that loved her. The promise I hold on to is that someday I will be with her and all the amazing, faithful women in my life, in the presence of Jesus, forever in joy! Even though it was my dad who was Pastor, it was my mom who taught me faith. The prayers at mealtimes and bedtimes, the conversations and love, the ways I watched her care for my siblings, her amazing cooking, baking, sewing, "treats for school birthday parties," and even the hectic "almost late" Sunday morning preparations instilled in my awareness the importance of the mothering call from God and how well she fulfilled that call. One of the gifts I have from my mother is that of music. Throughout her days she would sing. She would bring music into the dish soap, in the car, around the house, always singing. And then she would sit and play the piano. Early on, about third grade, she became my first piano teacher, sharing with me the life-lessons of music and discipline. Of course, the time came when I didn't want to practice, and another teacher was employed. But the lessons learned never departed from my spirit. I am grateful for her gifting me with music. So I approach this Mother's Day with combined gratitude and loss. I approach this day with joy as I see children lovingly supported and cared for. And I approach this day knowing the greater truth that God, in God's mothering love, gathers us and loves us unconditionally. Sometimes we see a glimpse of God in the mothers around us, and we are blessed. Thanks be to God!






Arresting Performances at Zoar to Help Those in Need!



Dorothy and Jim are looking forward to learning more about and contributing to the Zoar community of faith.








For those who love a good book


From I-75 North:
