#### A.G.O. RECITAL FEBRUARY 4<sup>TH</sup> 3:00 PM



### VALENTINE'S DAY TO APRIL FOOL'S DAY



These are two amazing dates in the secular calendar! Valentine's Day, originally a day to remember the martyrdom of St. Valentine and the love he had for his beloved, now is a day for us to express our love. And April Fool's Day, which became a joking day, humiliating those who forgot that the New Year had moved to January 1, continues as a day of jokes and pranks. Surprise!

These days will frame Lent, 2018. The fantastic juxtaposition on the Day of Love is that on one hand St. Valentine was martyred because he believed in the love of Jesus, and on the other hand it is precisely in our humanity that God in Jesus loves us so much. Ash Wednesday is not just a morbid realization, but a reality check – we are mortal, we will die, and we are loved. This is the greatest Valentine "card" ever given!

The 40 days (plus Sundays) in Lent then help us prepare. By the end of March we will have entered the Upper Room with the disciples, have had our feet washed, and have received Jesus in the bread and wine; we will sing our songs and prayers, and then head to the Garden; we will sleep while Jesus prays and is betrayed; we will witness as Jesus is crucified, dies, and is buried.

#### This much makes sense in our world. We know betrayal. We know death and burial. We are acquainted to grief and loss.

So imagine the surprise when Mary Magdalene goes to the tomb early on Sunday, to find that Jesus had been raised from the dead! Inconceivable! How fun that Easter this year falls on April Fool's Day! The Gospels record the surprise and unbelief of the disciples, and we see the same in our world today. How can it be that God in Jesus has risen from the dead? How can it be that someday we too shall rise? Is it really an April Fool's? The joy of our faith is that what may seem foolish to the world is in reality God's truth – that we are so beloved by God, that God in Jesus gave God's self so completely in death that we too might live with God. I am amaZed!

Love and surprise! Mortality and resurrection. In these days, let God's grace surround you with hope and joy!

# LOOKING BACKTO LOOK FORWARD

#### TEAMWORK BOTH BEHIND US AND AHEAD OF US

I've heard it said and read it in print that in order to know where you're going you've got to know where you've been. In other words, you've got to look back in order to look forward. As I look back on the past year at Zoar, the one word that comes to mind is TEAMWORK. Each area of ministry that I have been privileged to be a part of stands out because of the teamwork involved. Teamwork is what made Zoar's annual stewardship appeal so successful. Close to 70 people had a hand in creating the Transformed by Grace, Faith, and Love campaign that resulted in written financial commitments from 250 Zoar members to Jesus' work in the world. Teamwork is what has made Zoar's New Member Sunday so successful. Over a hundred people made Zoar their church home in 2017. There is no one reason people join the church. In fact, there are dozens of reasons including the warm greeting people receive, the terrific music during worship, the children's events, Zoar's music groups, the way ushers hand out bulletins, the small groups, the work the youth do, and on and on. For every one person that joins the church there are more than a dozen people who have helped make it possible. Teamwork is what makes Zoar's growth in small groups so successful. There are now over a hundred adults involved in a small group at Zoar. These include groups for women, men, Married Couples with Young Children, Parents of Young Adult Children, Young Couples with No Kids, Pickelball enthusiasts, Bowlers, Bridge lovers, basketball players, Cyclists (Slow Roll), Music, Bible study, and on and on. Teamwork is what makes our work to end hunger through Kitchen of Hope and Feed Our Families and our efforts to provide aid to the poor with quilts, blankets, and knitted items so successful year after year. Teamwork is what has made our efforts to communicate grow by leaps and bounds. Teamwork is what made Zoar's weekly worship attendance grow by almost 10% in 2017. Teamwork is what made Zoar's annual giving increase by 11% in 2017 over 2016. Teamwork is why Zoar's worship attendance increased by 12% in 2017 over 2016.

Looking back, there is a lot to celebrate. Looking forward there is a lot to do. What I see for the coming year and beyond is more of the same blessings. These are some of the efforts that God is richly blessing among us: 1) Small groups; 2) Stewardship; 3) Evangelism (church growth). Small groups: If 2017 was the year for launching Date Nite groups (for Married Couples with Young Children), then 2018 will be the year for launching several Christ Care groups, a new Faith, Science, and Technology Group, and a Hunting and Fishing group. Christ Care groups are monthly meetings of people of various ages and backgrounds for fun discussion, lite Bible study, and snacks. Stewardship: If 2017 was the year of our renewed annual Fall fund appeal, 2018 will introduce a renewed Time and Talent Spring campaign and a new legacy giving campaign. Church Growth: If 2017 was a year for 9% growth in attendance and an added 100 new members, then 2018 calls us to continue that path.

If the recent past teaches us the benefit of teamwork in Christ's work in the world, so shall the future. I encourage each and every one of us to do some soul-searching and ask ourselves if we are offering up to God our best effort for the life we share at Zoar.

# YOUTH STORIES

There are many heroes behind-the-scenes at Zoar, and a goal of this section is to help you get to know who they are and what they do for our youth ministries. This month, we'd like to introduce you to Marianne Wagner, the HS and Young Adult Sunday School instructor.

We spoke with Mrs. Wagner last month as the new year came around. She began by saying, "The level of maturity, empathy, humor, and faith demonstrated by the youth brings me so much joy... Zoar is really blessed with extraordinary kids!" That's exactly why she's taught for over seven years. #### 2018 REDEEMER SUMMERYOUTH PROGRAM



Summer Youth Program at Redeemer (located at 1702 Upton Ave) is a two 4-week programs that meet from 8:00 to 1:00 pm Monday through Friday from June 11 to July 3rd and July 9 to August 3rd to provide enriching summer activities and nutritious meals to neighborhood youth. This much-needed program supports the families of the working poor by providing a safe place for children to be during the day as well as providing food for families with limited resources. We rely on a multi-generational and diverse staff from mission churches and from the neighborhood to provide programming in the areas of Music, Arts, Recreation, and Bible study.

In addition several staff are needed to be Group Leaders, Preschool Leaders, or Camp Grandparents. Paid staff should be available for all or most of the summer; volunteers are welcomed as their schedule permits. Service hour requirements can also be met.

So I entreat you to sing with abandon during worship not forgetting what St. Augustine said so many centuries ago: "a person who sings prays twice."

A Prayer-walk Labyrinth will be set up for those who wish to take time to pray as they walk in the guided circle.

The Lenten journey will begin on February 14, Ash Wednesday. An additional brief worship service will begin the day at 7:00 AM for those headed to work. At all services on this day we will have ashes imposed upon us, symbols of our mortality, as well as the gift of Holy Communion given.


