THE BENEFITS OF CHURCH

NEW YORK TIMES HEADLINE

It's not a surprise to most of us at Zoar that church is good for us, but an article in the New York Times shared some ideas as to why: "ONE of the most striking scientific discoveries about religion in recent years is that going to church weekly is good for you. Religious attendance boosts the immune system and decreases blood pressure. It may add as much as two to three years to your life. The reason for this is not entirely clear. Social support is no doubt part of the story. At the churches I've studied as an anthropologist, people really did seem to look out for one another. They showed up with dinner when friends were sick and sat to talk with them when they were unhappy. The help was sometimes surprisingly concrete. Perhaps a third of the church members belonged to small groups that met weekly to talk about the Bible and their lives. One evening, a young woman in a group began to cry. Her dentist had told her that she needed a \$1,500 procedure, and she didn't have the money. Amazingly, the small group — most of them students — simply covered the cost, by anonymous donation."

Over the months, years, or decades that you have been a part of the community at Zoar, certainly you have your reasons for why attending worship is important for you. Think about these. Write them down. Pray about them. Give thanks to God for them. Then, as you prepare yourself to invite a friend to church you will do so with greater clarity and conviction.

You may have heard the news, but let's make it official: I am happy to announce that my position has been renamed to "Cantor." The word has a long history in the Christian tradition; its roots go back to the days of the Jewish temple. I am sure you know or may have heard the name of our most celebrated cantor: J.S. Bach (1685-1750).

For five-hundred years, the Lutheran Church has held on to or reclaimed this title as part of its distinguished inheritance. The expression conveys the duties of a music director (i.e., managing, scheduling, etc.), while also giving voice to the ministry of music (leading of the people's singing, and helping the people recount and proclaim the story of God's grace in song). I want to thank our Worship and Music and Personnel committees, and our Church's Council, for acknowledging this critical historical connection in our joint Christian journey.

The Bible tells several powerful stories of refugees like the story of Moses and the Exodus. Most of us know the Exodus story when the Israelites were aliens in Egypt and mistreated. This experience of living as aliens and refugees was so painful and frightening that God ordered his people for all time to have special care for the alien: "You shall treat the alien who resides with you no differently than the natives born among you; have the same love for him as for yourself; for you too were once aliens in the land of Egypt" (Leviticus 19:33-34). A lot gets said about the immigration "crisis" in our country. Let our words reflect the compassion and concern of our heavenly Father.


