FIVE HUNDRED ONE

What has happened this past 501 years? The American Revolution, cultivation of electricity, the founding of Zoar, growing equality for women, people of color, and the LGBTQ+ communities, discovery of how microbes work (including yeast!), advances in medicine, E-books, closer ties around the world, and...

On October 31, 1517, Dr. Martin Luther nailed his 95
Theses to the Church door, His call was to reform the church - re-center it on Scripture, re-form the sacraments back into the two called for by Jesus (Holy Baptism and Holy Communion), re-model the Church from hierarchy back into a communion, re-introduce salvation by grace through faith in Jesus Christ.

Last year we were able to commemorate this 500th anniversary. But for me the joy of this anniversary was that we remembered it with our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters. Gathered in worship, in prayer, in scripture- and history-studies each of our respective denominations came to a deeper understanding of the Reformation, and of how each of us are "church" today.

What remains central for me is that the community of God's people hold in common the truth that God in Jesus has done for us what we could not do for ourselves. Out of God's eternal love, God's unfailing forgiveness, and God's grace wrapped around all of God's people, we are a new creation. God in Jesus took our brokenness and sin, nailed it to the cross, broke the chains of death, and created a new community of grace.

This is the Good News our world (and our own selves) needs to hear! We are freed in Christ! We are loved by God! We are wrapped in grace! We are given the gift of peace that this world cannot understand! We are granted a higher calling – that of loving and serving the neighbor.

So, sisters and brothers, take stock of your life and how you serve. What needs to be 're-formed?" Where does the amaZing love of Jesus call you to be reenergized? What new songs can your soul sing as you become more deeply aware of God's love? How can your blessing become a blessing for those around you?

Many changes have happened this 501 years. The years ahead, with all the curves and changes, will be awash in God's grace and love, until the amaZing final day when Christ returns. May that day come!




