## BRICK CAMPAIGN PAVESTHE WAY TAKE YOUR FIRST STEP

Dlans are underway to renovate the Courtyard between

the sanctuary and music wing. After 20 months of researching and hosting several informational meetings, the recommendation of the Task Force was unanimously accepted by church council and approved by the congregation in August with 89% voting in favor of the project. The renovation to the Courtyard and its adjacent landscape will 1) increase the visibility of the church; 2) increase the functional use of the space; and 3) create an area for the interment of ashes for members who wish to have their cremains surrounded by an active faith community. To finance these improvements, an engraved brick campaign has been launched. Your name, or that of someone you wish to honor or remember, will be lazer printed on a clay brick, and placed in a winding path that begins at the Sandusky Street entrance and continues through the courtyard, replacing the existing concrete slabs. Until September 9 - bricks can be ordered for \$125. After that date, bricks can be ordered at special times throughout the year for \$150. Order forms are on the church website, in the Gathering Space and in the Church Office. Help create a lasting legacy for the future and a beautiful, updated space for all to enjoy. Remember, the initial BRICK CAMPAIGN at a reduced rate ends Sunday, September 9.







# **CROSS - CENTERED LIVING**

Greetings, sisters and brothers! As we delve into autumn, I pray that you know God's richest grace!

This September article is centered on an event that occurred in this month. Back in the early 300's, newly-Christian Roman Emperor Constantine sent his mother, Helena, to search out the sites of Jesus and the disciples, so that churches be built on those sacred spots. When she arrived, she found that many of the sites had already been enshrined in the memories of local people. For instance, the grave of St. Peter was already known to be in a certain spot in Rome, so Constantine built St. Peter's Cathedral there.

Helena went to Israel and was led to the traditional spot of the crucifixion of Jesus. There she "found" the "True Cross," Later revered by many and debunked by some, the cross ultimately was divided up throughout the Roman Empire. On October 14, 335, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher was consecrated on the spot where the cross was found.

Now, this isn't really a history lesson, but a time to center on God's love. In all of God's mercy, God's plan was that in Jesus, God would redeem the world. As you know, Jesus was nailed to the cross, dying through Roman political punishment. For many years the Church was unable to use the cross as symbol, due to his disgusting nature. Rather the "fish" symbol was used (The Greek letters for fish were the 1st letters in "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior") Eventually the cross became a primary symbol for the Church.

I would like you, right here, as you are reading this, to close your eyes, and imagine a cross. Notice how the vertical line links the top of heaven to the very edge of earth. Notice also how the horizonal line could go on forever. As you imagine and gaze, let the fulness of God's love fill you, as God in heaven took our flesh on earth, and as God reached out nailed-hands to embrace you and the whole world. Be surrounded in God's act of love for you, and for the world. And in that warming-love, give thanks. For God so loved the world, that God gave God's only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall be saved.

Blessings, sisters and brothers, as the love of God through the cross leads you each day!

### COURTYARD DESTINED FOR PRAISE MULTIPURPOSE SPACE TO STRENGTHEN MISSION

Time Magazine's "Cremation: The New American Way of Death" highlights a very real issue that is a growing concern as more Americans choose cremation as a preferred disposition choice. What do you do with the ashes? Statistics from the Cremation Association of North America (CANA) show that in 2017, the US cremation rate was 51.6%. By 2022, the US cremation rate is projected to reach 57.8%. The choice is very personal, but those who prefer cremation often site the desire for a simpler and more affordable funeral alternative, and the desire to be buried in an area surrounded by a vibrant faith community where the family has a history. Zoar has responded to this request by offering an area in the Courtyard for the "direct burial" of ashes in a bio-degradable linen bag. Within 4 - 6 months, the bag and ashes will be "returned" to the earth. An interment fee of \$800 will be held in a separate account for the perpetual maintenance of the garden and managed by a six-member Courtyard Garden board. The redesigned Courtyard provides a safe and final resting place for the cremains of Zoar members, former members, and their families. While the Courtyard is designed to be a multi-purpose space for activities such as Easter Egg hunt, small services, and social hour - beautiful artwork, landscaping and benches also provide a place for quiet reflection. Pre-arrangement for interment prior to death, can be made. In such case, after discussing one's request with a Zoar pastor, the application including payment in full, may be submitted and held in the church office.


