## WE DON'T NEEDTO BE AFRAID

here is a well-worn story about Christmas that bears repeating: A certain family had a tradition where the Mother and children would go to the Christmas Eve service, and the Father would stay home and read the paper. The Father was not a bad man, but he just couldn't believe in the childhood stories anymore of God coming as a baby in a manger. As soon as the family left for church, he opened up the paper and began to read by the fireplace. Suddenly, he heard something bang into the window. The man thought the bird flew into the glass trying to get out of the snow into the warmth of his home. He felt for the bird, and went outside, hoping to bring it in. But as he approached the bird, the bird just flew against the window even harder. Pretty soon, the bird fell into the bushes below the window, half frozen, yet too afraid to be caught by this huge man. The more the man tried to reach for the bird, the more the bird flew frantically into the snow and thorns of the bushes. After a few minutes in the cold and seeing the bird continue to injure itself, the man yelled out in frustration, "Stupid bird, can't you understand that I'm trying to help?" The man paused and thought, "If only you understood you wouldn't fly away ... if only ... if only I could become a bird, and get you to understand." With the baby in a manger, we learn one of the most important lessons of faith. God is not out to get us. We don't need to be afraid of God. God is here to help.

# **WELCOMETO ADVENT**

Sometimes I like waiting: the peaceful moment as clouds come across the horizon bringing rain; a chance to pause and breathe in the beauty around me; time spent with family as a loved one is preparing to enter God's eternal kingdom; and even the occasional gift of a red traffic light, during which I stop the forward hustle for just a moment.

But much more often I do not like to wait: for a visit to a new grandchild; for healing in the leg; for a festival to come; and, also, sometimes at that traffic light, when I don't want to stop the forward hustle!

Welcome to Advent! All around us the culture has brought out the Christmas cheer (even before Halloween!) But wait – not yet! We still have to (or get to) journey through the advent season of waiting.

We wait because we know Jesus is coming again. We wait for the end of pain, of brokenness, of disease and death, of fear, of strife between nations and in our own families. We also wait for the time to see Jesus face-to-face, to know only joy, to be reunited with loved ones who are in God's eternal Kingdom. The promise is that one day the waiting will be over. Alleluia!

And we wait, as with an expectant parent, for the joy of the birth of Jesus. We journey with the surprisingly pregnant Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem. And there, at the right time, after centuries of waiting, Mary gives birth to her first-born son, wraps him in bands of cloth, and lays him in a manger (See St. Luke). This is where we first come to find hope in our waiting, and joy in our days.

We also know that the day will come when Mary's Son will take death on our behalf, conquer it, and rise to glory. Our waiting has promise, and hope, and joy, because of Jesus.

So, as you journey through these days, take a moment to breathe in the joy of Jesus' presence. For some of you there will be no time this month, with lives full of activity and family. For others, you have plenty of time on your hands. But I call each of you to find a time to stop and give thanks for the abundant blessings you have received. Jesus is waiting for you with love!




