### LEADERSHIP RETREAT: SETS GOALS FOR 2019

The Church Leadership Team, comprised of Council members, committee chairs, pastors and church staff, met on March 2<sup>ND</sup> at beautiful St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Toledo to discuss priorities and plans for Zoar in 2019. We reflected on Zoar's vision to gather, grow and give. The team also considered the general mission of the ELCA to find means of nurturing Zoar members in the Word of God to grow in faith, hope, and love and to reach out to people to bring them to faith. Discussion on our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats produced three major initiatives for 2019 and task forces to address them:

- 1. The Worship Task Force will explore and make recommendations to Council by January 2020 about worship in all formats.
- 2. The Data & Software Task Force will investigate the data needs of the church and identify software options to address those needs. The task force will make a recommendation to Council by January 2020 on a software package.
- The Safety Task Force will create and submit to Council by January 2020 a Safety Plan using the ELCA Generic Safety Template as a guide.

The task forces will be reaching out for input from Zoar members during their investigations, so please watch for opportunities to provide your thoughts. Your involvement and engagement is critical to our church's mission. Thank you to all who generously and skillfully serve the church.

# THE MOST AMAZING MYSTERY OF ALL

"April is in my mistress' face." Now, there's a unique way to start a newsletter article!! In 1594, Thomas Morley, a contemporary of William Shakespeare, penned these words as the beginning of a sonnet. His mistress shone with the light of April.

Ah, there's the connection! What a joyous month, April is! What a month of light and beauty and grace! And as Mr. Morley saw the delight of this month in the face of his mistress, so that light blinds us with God's grace.

Spring! Everywhere April sings of new life. Plants erupting from dirt and from buds, birds returning filling the air with glorious sounds, longer days of warming, and color all around. Yes, it is true that I deeply love winter, but when spring comes it is a delight. For many early cultures the year began in spring, for it seems that the world wakes up from its "long winter nap."

Saints! ### OFFERING OF LETTERS SET FOR APRIL

Can you please write one letter? This letter will provide a voice for the poor children of this world. The theme for this year's letter writing is **Better Nutrition**, **Better** Tomorrow. It focuses on the need that all children deserve the opportunity to live a healthy life and reach their full potential.

Hunger and poverty rates have been cut in half over the past 30 years. But the number of people experiencing hunger around the world has increased for the third year in a row. BFW offering of letters for 2019 would urge our government to accelerate progress toward ending hunger by increasing funding for global child nutrition programs, including breastfeeding, safe drinking water and sanitation. One in 4 of the world's children are affected by stunting, and almost half of all child deaths worldwide are linked to malnutrition.

Information will be shared on Sunday, April 7<sup>TH</sup> for you to write to your congress person or Senator. Then during the week you will write your letter and return it to your church service on April 14th for a blessing before being mailed out.


Please note: The easter egg hunt will be organized by age to allow our littlest hunters time to find an Easter treat! Be sure to attend the entire event so as not to miss your age group!



### LENTEN OFFERINGTO HELP RELIEF EFFORTS

Just days after Zoar members Barb and Art Peters moved to Port St. Joe, Florida, hurricane Michael made landfall on October 10th just north of their new but not quite finished home. A category 4, the strongest on record in the Florida panhandle this hurricane caused about \$25.1 Billion in damage in Mexico Beach.

Though Barb and Art lived a mile from the greatest devastation, they were forced out of their home for 2 months, living in a hotel about 3 hours away as the local hotels were used for emergency personnel. Their town still feels like a war zone according to Barb. There are a few restuarants, businesses and medical help up and running again where the Peter's live, but not yet in Mexico Beach. Several churches have been destroyed and attendance is sparce at the churches trying to stay open.

Providing offerings to ELCA disaster response at this Lenten time will help provide the continuing financial support needed in their long struggle to rebuild. 


