Sisters and brothers of Zoar – greetings in the Name of our Risen Lord Jesus! May this month be one for you of refreshment in God's grace! So, let us remember:

There are wonderful people in my family (parents, aunts/uncles, grandparents, neighbors,) who shared with me the kindness of God, but also, I remember with thanksgiving the many members of Zoar who used to sit in these pews, who are now singing praises in the Kingdom of Heaven. Thanks be to God for these saints!

MUSIC IN MAY

Two weeks into the season of Easter, the great Week of Weeks, we would like to share with you a preview of the readings which will give shape to our corporate worship in the month ahead. As you already know, these readings will anchor our proclamation, and the themes and images we hear will be further explored and developed in the sermon and our hymnody. Every Sunday the sermon and our hymns complement each other in proclaiming the Gospel. A beautiful characteristic of our tradition is that the preacher and the congregation, both in the sermon and the hymns, share in the homiletical task: the priesthood of all believers in action as each “gospels” the other.

In the month of May, the month where, according to American essayist Edwin Way Teale, “all things seem possible,”- Our episodes from the Gospel of John will anchor our proclamation of the Word. On Easter 3 (May 4/5), the Risen Christ appears to his disciples, and we will meditate on how this is still true for us today. On Easter 4 (May 11/12), Jesus promises life to his sheep, and we will delve into the image of the good shepherd who commands his disciples to feed and tend his sheep. On Easter 5 (May 18/19), we revisit Jesus’ Great Commandment, “love one another,” which we heard on Maundy Thursday, but now is spoken to the early followers of The Way in a tone of post-resurrection commendation. On Easter 6 (May 25/26), we, along with the apostles, are given the promise of a teacher and reminder -the Holy Spirit-, along with the peace of Christ which surpasses all understanding.

So here is our invitation: Would you, as part of a spiritual practice, be willing to examine how the connections between readings, preaching, and hymns inform and enrich your worship experience and adoration? How do these connections deepen your insight into worship, and, more importantly, how are they embodied and reflected in the way you approach worship? What would happen if we were to consider our church experience - our sacrifice of praise - as our preaching, proclamation, and witness to the world?

ZOAR FOUNDATION HISTORY

In January 1987, an Endowment fund was formed at Zoar. There were originally six members to the Endowment Fund Board. In 2007 at the Annual Congregational Meeting the Zoar Lutheran Church Foundation was formed. It was created as a non-profit organization to support the worthy causes and programs of Zoar Lutheran. The Foundation Board believes it will accomplish this purpose through the encouragement and support of:

- Congregational outreach to the community and beyond. Examples of such outreach include (but are not limited to) the support of local and regional efforts to serve the poor and relieve suffering, the participation in mission trips to more distant destinations in the USA and beyond, members' leadership and participation in ELCA and ecumenical efforts such as Lutheran Disaster Response, ELCA Global Mission, and Lutheran World Relief, congregational efforts to innovate by developing new ministries and new approaches to on-going ministries;
- Congregational efforts to develop its lay and pastoral leadership through youth development activities beyond the scope of Zoar's ongoing youth ministry programs, support (through the Kazmeier Fund) of young people pursuing careers in the ordained pastoral ministry, support for special training experiences for lay and pastoral congregational leaders;

- Congregational efforts to bring the best of Christian music (and other arts) to Zoar Lutheran and its community through performances open to community, special engagements of artists in regular or special worship services, support for Zoar artists intent on sharing their gifts beyond the Zoar Lutheran community; and

- Combined judgment of Foundation Board members to respond flexibly to congregational needs or opportunities.

DISTRIBUTIONS

Since 2010 the Zoar Lutheran Foundation board has been distributing funds twice a year. Grant request deadlines are March 31st and a second date of September 30th is available if funds are remaining. Requests must be received by these dates and completed on the approved Grant Request Form, found at www.zoarlutheran.com, to be considered by the Zoar Foundation Board.

Since 2010 the Zoar Foundation has distributed \$360,264 from the Foundation Fund, \$12,709 from the Kazmaier Fund and \$189,162 from the Kurfis Fund. The Foundation has funded fun projects such as a Guitar Camp, a Theatre and Music camp, Fall Family Camp, Monthly Mingles and new videography equipment.

Now in 2019, the Foundation operates as a separate non-profit organization with 12 board members who meet regularly to serve the Zoar Congregation.

SUPPORT

You can contribute to the Foundation through estate bequests, life insurance policies, memorials, charitable trusts, gift annuities, real estate, or personal gifts. By bequeathing to Zoar Lutheran's Foundation and including instructions in your will, you are assured that your wishes will be followed.

The Zoar Lutheran Foundation was established to support and promote the charitable, educational and religious ministries of Zoar Lutheran Church. Here at Zoar several of our ministries focus on feeding our hungry neighbors. Through these ministries we have provided thousands of meals, groceries and personal items to those in need.

Kitchen of Hope

Kitchen of Hope has served over 10,000, hot, home-cooked meals over the past 12 years. Kitchen of Hope occurs on the last Friday of each month beginning in September and ending in May. Typical dates for Thanksgiving and Christmas meals change due to the holidays. Meals are shared in the Zoar Lutheran Family Life Center. There is no charge for Kitchen of Hope Meals. Zoar offers this opportunity to all residents of Wood County, regardless of age, income, race or church affiliation. Donations can be made to this ministry in honor or in memory of a loved one.

Perrysburg Christians United

PCU is a local non-profit organization which is supported by Zoar and other Perrysburg churches. PCU operates a food pantry that serves those who live in Wood County north of State Route 582. Those receiving food assistance must present two proof's of address (for example, a photo ID and a recent utility bill) and must verify that their income falls within the guidelines of the Ohio Department of Job's and Family Services.

The pantry operates on the following schedule:

MONDAYS from 1:00 - 3:00 PM

FRIDAYS from 9:00 - 11:00 AM

PCU's pantry is located in the southeast corner of the parking lot of Grace United Methodist Church, 601 East Boundary St. in Perrysburg.

Feed Our Families

Feed our Families was created in 2009 and provides free meals and groceries during the summer months for families in Wood County whose children qualify for the federally assisted lunch program during the school year. Meals are served each Friday at noon beginning in early June and ending mid August. Families are provided with breakfast and lunch groceries for the coming week. Proof of current Wood County residency is required.
