WORSHIP IN AUGUST

August 4, Common Revised Lectionary 18

We wonder what a "new self, renewed in knowledge" might be in the context of today's gospel. The pointlessness of pursuing worldly possessions is made explicit (as the first reading tells us, "all is vanity and chasing after the wind"). As we set our minds of things above, we pray with the psalmist for "a mind of wisdom and a heart of understanding." The hymn Be Thou My Vision (ELW 793) will encapsulate our assembly's proclamation.

August 11, CRL 19

Continuing his teachings on true discipleship and against greed, Jesus admonishes his followers to "make purses... that do not wear out." On this weekend, we hear how we have been given Christ as our heavenly country. Knowing that in him God has freely given us the kingdom, we will praise with thankful hearts, trusting that in all things God works with us, as our Hymn of the Day, Have no Fear Little Flock (ELW 764), cheerfully reminds us.

August 18, CRL 20

In this day's Gospel, Jesus' fiery words speak of broken relationships. We will have a chance to meditate on how paradoxical it seems that even in ministry life conflict is born out of Jesus' peace-filled activities. Even then, we are to lay aside our anxiety and greed and to turn our hearts to the treasures of God's promised kingdom, where Christ takes division upon himself on the cross. On this weekend, we will pray fervently for God's compassion and the restoration of right relationships. Our community will round out this message by singing ELW 788 If God My Lord Be for Me.

August 25, CRL 21

A wise man once said: if your religion forces you to choose between your faith and your neighbor, always choose your neighbor." In today's reading Jesus calls hypocrites those who put regulations and the law in front of and above others' needs and suffering. Means and ends are not only the stuff of utilitarian philosophy but of Christian living. We, like the cured woman, may say, "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless God's holy name" (Psalm 103). We will consider what it means to praise and bless the Lord, with and in everything we do. Our Hymn of the Day will be How Firm the Foundation (ELW 796).

EXPLORE ZO

Zoar will host a Ministry Fair on Sunday, September 8, from 9:30 to 12:30 in the Family Life Center. All Zoar members, as well as visitors hoping to learn more about Zoar's ministry programs, are invited to attend. Attendees will be able to "EXPLORE ZOAR" and its unique opportunities to Gather, Grow and Give. The fair will include information booths from a variety of ministry opportunities at Zoar as well as opportunities to join in, learn more and receive regular updates on ministries that meet personal needs and interests. The event will also offer fair-themed food, carnival games and children's activities. In addition, a special Sunday School Preview will be held from 9:45-10:15, where students will be able to meet their Sunday School teachers and get a taste for the upcoming year's activities.

Why a Ministry Fair?

Zoar has historically offered many ministry opportunities. Still, many longtime members, as well as new members, are unaware of this wide range of offerings.

Pastor Tim, said the purpose of this fair is two-fold, to provide awareness and connection. "We want to highlight the ministries of Zoar, to make people aware of what is available, but also help people connect with the various activities and ministries here."

Why Rally Sunday?

The ministry fair coincides with a longstanding Zoar tradition, Rally Sunday. Historically, this day has marked the beginning of fall Sunday

School. Pastor Tim likened it to a baseball game in which the mascot strives to renew enthusiasm within the crowd, in order to encourage a hitting spree and rejuvenate the team's score. He explained, "Rally Sunday serves as a call, with the summer vacation over, to come back together as a family and get back involved with life at Zoar."

Though Sunday School will officially begin the following Sunday, children will begin the ministry fair by meeting their Sunday School teachers, exploring their classrooms and getting a preview of what they'll learn this year. In addition, those who have not yet registered for Sunday School will be able to do so on site.

Why Connect?

Why would Zoar members desire to get involved beyond weekend church attendance? "Because as a community, we are in this ministry together," said Pastor Tim, "and Jesus calls us to connect with each other within this community and the greater world." The intent of the EXPLORE ZOAR Ministry Fair is to allow everyone to find a place within Zoar's ministry offerings, no matter their reason for getting involved.

Les Buker, a member of the property support team, desired to put some actions behind his faith, referring to James 2:26, which reads, "For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is also dead." (NRSV) He found that helping with the property team fit well with his talents and strengths. "I'm not a real social person, but mowing the lawn

and working on the grounds was what I could do." He also mentioned the added benefits of Saturday morning donuts and fellowship.

Jodi Cline and her family joined a small group with not much prior knowledge, just a desire to become more involved at Zoar and meet families with similar-aged kids. "We love it," she said. "First we were strangers, and now we are friends. It's a great way to meet other people and for their kids to get to know each other as well."

Visitors to the fair will be able to explore a variety of ministries and choose one that best fits their interests and strengths and also adjusts to any perceived barriers to becoming involved.





Buker, who considers himself introverted, encourages others who may have similar feelings to give it a try. "I have to work hard to work with others, but at Zoar it wasn't that hard," he said. "People make it easy to work with others."

Cline said her group understands the hectic and ever-changing schedules of families with kids, and she encourages others to not let that deter them from becoming more involved or joining a group. "If it's a time thing, our group kind of works it out where we can still meet together," she said, referencing working around various activities from month to month in order to schedule a time that works for all.

Why Reach Out?

While the ministry fair is a great chance for members to become more involved at Zoar, those unfamiliar with Zoar will also find this to be a great time to check out what Zoar has to offer.

"There's something about the immediate neighborhood that should be a primary place for letting people know of God's love." Pastor Tim said. "In Acts 1:8, Jesus says, 'You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' So there's this Biblical precedent of the most immediate home being where we start."

In the weeks leading up to the fair, current Zoar members will be asked to pray for those who live nearest to our building and extend a personal invitation to them by participating in a door-knocker canvasing event. (More details to come.) Be sure to join us at EXPLORE ZOAR and learn all that Zoar has to offer.

GATHER/GROW/GIVE WOMENS GROUPS

Throughout each month the women of Zoar Gather in Fellowship, Grow in their faith and Give back to the community. Consider joining one of these meaningul groups to become more connected with the women of Zoar.

Women's Circles

Througout the month several women's groups meet in bible study. The Rachel Circle meets on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 1 PM, the Ruth Circle meets on the 2nd Monday of the month at 1 PM and the Naomi Circle meets on the 3rd Thursday of the month at 9:15 AM.

Popcorn Gang

Popcorn Gang meets on the 2nd Monday of the month at 6 PM and is a group of women of all ages getting to know each other through sharing or listening.

Yarns of Love

Started nine years ago, this group meets monthly to knit or crochet a variety of items for Zoar Lutheran members who are shutins or ill, as well as those in both Kingston facilities, Hospice of Northwest Ohio, Perrysburg Commons and Heartland. Items include chemo caps, lap robes, etc. The group gathers on the second Saturday of each month from 10 - 11:30 AM and on the last Monday of each month from 7 - 8:30 PM.

Piece Corp Quilters

The Piece Corp Quilters Group has been in existence for nearly 50 years and is a part of Zoar Lutheran's efforts to support Lutheran World Relief. The group meets to tie quilt tops to backs and to make kits that include school bags, diaper bags, baby gowns, etc. All are welcome to join in this rewarding work, no matter what age or skill level.

Quilting tips are shared among the group. The Piece Corp Quilters Group meets the first Tuesday of each month at 9 AM as well as the third Wednesday of each month at 12:30 PM. Donations are also always welcome.

These can include fabrics, clean gently-used t-shirts, blankets, mattress pads, etc.

Solo Again - Widow Support Group

September 2018 began a new ministry of Zoar – to support women whose husbands have died recently. The first years after a death are very difficult to maneuver emotionally and financially. Solo Again offers a safe place to share emotions, ask questions, share helpful tips and information with others in the same situation and offer support to make a new life easier to handle. Loss can be harder than we think, and more beautiful than we imagined. Not the loss itself, but what comes from it. The collateral beauty. The treasure unearthed from the rubble left behind from the unexpected reactions of this experience. Grief and resilience live together at this time and Solo Again exists to help navigate these new experiences to see the beauty left behind.

There are many new books on dealing with grief and death of a spouse in the Library down stairs on the top right shelf that can be checked out for a month at a time.
