7:15 AM SERVICE SUNDAY, APRIL 19[™]

The final Sunday for this 7:15 AM Service will be April 19TH, the 2ND Sunday of Easter. We encourage all of you who have been part of this service to come and share in the "send-off," and then to continue to find your home on Saturday at 6 PM, or Sunday at 8:30 or 11 AM.









INTHE MIDST OF ALLTHE CHANGE

There's something special about April. Even though I love winter and cold and snow, April arrives, and it is welcomed. God's paintbrush comes out with greens and reds and yellows and blues. Days are longer, and the sounds of birds ring through the atmosphere. April is awesome!

This year the beauty of creation is magnified by the celebration of our Lord's Resurrection. We will have explored "jars" in Scripture, vessels through which God's mercy and grace have flowed. Now we journey up to the Upper Room, the Garden of Gethsemane, Calvary, and Joseph's tomb. As you know the story, Mary Magdalene comes then to the tomb on Sunday, prepared to complete the burial process. But she finds it empty and meets the risen Lord.

Nothing, not even death, is outside of God's love. So, as you come out of this mild winter into spring, how are things with your soul? I know that there are many things swirling around – changes in our climate, stress in our political system, brokenness in our families, and deep holes of need in our own spirits. It is into this very maelstrom that God has chosen to dwell. From the beginning of time, emptied into the Babe of Bethlehem, crucified where I should have been, and then risen from the tomb – God embraces all God's people with love, with healing, and with grace.

Change is in the air. The world is changing. Our families are changing. Church is changing. Easter brings the biggest change of all, for we find out that what we thought was constant (death) is no longer constant. We will die, but it's not the end. We will go through struggles and changes and pain in our days, but they are not ultimate. What is ultimate is this amaZing love God has for you and for me, for all of God's people. As St. Paul reminds us in Romans, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God!"

There's something special about April. It can be seen and smelled and felt. And this spring-i-ness is just a metaphor for the new things that God is doing – in creation, in the world, in history, and even in our own lives. I pray that in this spring, as well as the season ahead, you know the constant love of God in the midst of all that is changing!

WORSHIP IN APRIL

This month, the Common Revised Lectionary will take us through the central story of our faith: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Holy week begins with Palm Sunday and culminates with Easter Sunday, and in between is the unpacking of the gift of faith, the most important three days in of the Church year. In Latin, it is called the Triduum: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter, a liturgy so rich in meaning, it takes three days to explore its contours and to begin to plumb its depth. This year we may hear these stories at home, or later in the year, when we are able to meet again as a gathered community of faith.

April 5, Palm Sunday

On this Palm/Passion Sunday, we will begin our worship by singing Hosannas as we welcome Jesus to Jerusalem. A few moments later, during the reading of the Passion according to Matthew, we will shout "Crucify him!" As we hear Philippians 2:5-11, with join first century-Christians in a profound Credal statement. In Isaiah 50:4-9, we learn about the third Servant Song, in which we see a forecast about Jesus' humiliation despite his innocence.

April 9, 10, 11, Triduum: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil

On "Commandment" Thursday, Jesus tells his disciples that they are to love one another, "just as I have loved you." By this definition, love means compassion, mercy, and plenty of hard work. As we see in today's gospel, Jesus' love is active in service and, ultimately, sacrifice. On Friday, as we meditate on the consequences of God's sacrifice, the church proclaims the good news that the cross of Christ is not only necessary but also sufficient for our salvation. The Great Vigil is at the heart of our faith, a night where we connect with some of the greatest stories of our faith heritage unfurled in one sitting. Through the drama of Easter Vigil, our community of faith is invited to honest reflection and real renewal.

April 12, Easter Sunday

Theologian Gail Ramshaw has quipped, "Easter turns the whole world upside down. The incredible reversals of Easter offer the mystical possibility of transformation in every moment. In this season, what is dying, and what is being born? For our communities? For our families? For our world? What is breaking open like a seed to die (John 12:24) so that new life might thrive?

April 19, Second Sunday of Easter

Thomas wanted nothing more than the same experience of the risen Christ the rest of the disciples had. Jesus returns a second time and offers his body as living proof to Thomas. In the presence of Jesus, Thomas discovers he did not need the evidence he demanded. Thomas' story is our story: Jesus comes to us, seeking us out and giving us the gift of faith and teaching us what the words "Peace be with you" mean when lived out.

April 26, Third Sunday of Easter

On this Sunday, we hear about three thousand people who were baptized and about two disciples who were surprised to discover that they were eating a meal with the Risen Christ. We will celebrate our baptism, and we will pay attention to Christ, whom we find in the scriptures and recognize at our table.

It is because of his death and resurrection that we can sing the words of hymn ELW 666: What wondrous love is this! That Christ laid aside his crown for my soul!

It is because of his death and resurrection that we can join Paul when he says in 1 Corinthians 15: "Behold I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet."

It is because of his death and resurrection that we can say, "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?"

Therefore, let us remember the prayerful words from Sigismund von Birken, who in the seventeenth century gifted the Church with the text from ELW 803: Let us gladly die with Jesus. / Since by death he conquered death, /he will free us from destruction, /give to us immortal breath. /...and the grave that shuts us in / shall but prove the gate of heaven. Jesus, here with you I die, / there to live with you on high. Peace and Joy!

Blessings to you in these uncertain times. But there are a few truths and items we hold onto:



The Church is not closed! Just the building, including the Office during the week and the Sanctuary during the weekend. We are the Church, the Body of Christ, together even while separate, united by the Holy Spirit, reaching out to those in need. At this point we will be distributing Palms and Scripture readings April 5 (Palm/Passion Sunday). You may drive through the Zoar parking lot and receive your Palm branches from 10 – 11am. Also, on Good Friday (April 10) the Toledo Churches will post on Facebook a reading of the 2 chapters of the Passion of Jesus according to St. John.

Since we don't know how long this time will exist. We have made the decision to postpone Easter until a later date. Remember – Christ is Risen! (He is Risen Indeed!) It will be such a delight to worship together again! Please follow the Zoar Facebook Page and and join the Zoar Groups. We will have extra opportunities for worship digitally throughout Holy Week and on Easter.

ZOAR LIBRARY BOOKS BY ZOAR AUTHORS

Included in our collection in the Zoar Library are several books written by authors who are or who have been members of Zoar. A brief bibliography includes:

Accola, Lou, Rev.. "Spirituality: Aspects of Christian Life and Renewal." Pastor Lou, who was at Zoar 1984-1992, produced this pamphlet for the American Lutheran Church to "stimulate reflection (of spirituality) and action in congregations."

Georgeson, Michael, "Broken Record." 2020. Michael records several of his poems, mostly written in his high school years.

Kluepful, Peter, Rev., "Animals of the New Testament." 1939. Pastor Kluepful served at Zoar from 1916-1944 has chronicled the animals in the New Testament, presenting both a bit of explanation and then a poem/hymn for each.


Laird, Donna. "Negotiating Power in Ezra-Nehemiah." 2016. This, Donna's Doctoral-Thesis-in-book-form is an excellent exploration of all that was happening in the post-exilic time of Ezra and Nehemiah.

Melchert, Charles, "Wise Teaching: Biblical Wisdom and Educational Ministry." 1998. Charles, one of the sons of Pastor Melchert, weaves wisdom from the Scriptures with educational theory.

Murphy, Shawn, "A Bold Faith: Develop the focus necessary to lead a strong and active life of faith." 2011. Shawn, the host of The Strong Christian podcast, and a 1986 confirmand of Zoar, focuses in on growth an development in five key areas of faith.

Puerwal, Sukhjit, Dr. (Sarge), "Destiny: A family saga." 2015. Sarge chronicles his history from his grandfather in India and his coming to the US., complete with predictions of the future life of his grandfather and his family.

Richter, Glen & Mary, "Breakfast with Hummingbirds: Celebrating 50 Years of Marriage and Birding." Glen (photos) and Mary (narrative) explore the weaving of bird-sighting and marriage over these 50 years.
