"How Long, O Lord, How Long?"

This year, I am thrilled to celebrate Christmas even now, before Thanksgiving! Get the decorations out! Sing the songs! Light the candles. These Covid-days call us to focus on what is really important – and right now we need a little hope! Hope that this time will come to an end, and we with gather together (differently) in joy. Hope that the precautions we take will make a difference for us and for those around us. Hope that these days are not defined by a disease but by grace,

forgiveness, family, joy. Because when God wrapped God's self in flesh, and then 30 some years later God's dead flesh rose from the grave God promised God's presence here and now and reminds us that all things are in God's hands of grace. As Paul wrote in Romans, "All things work together for good."

Yep- bring on the tinsel! Put up the trees. Jesus is here, right in our midst. God's love is so much stronger than Covid, God's family through Zoar is so much better connected than Covid, and God's hands hold all of God's people in joy.



## NATIVITY WALKTHROUGH

Zoar Lutheran Church will offer a Christmas Candlelight Walk through its decorated worship spaces every Sunday from 6-7pm, beginning Nov. 29 until Dec 20. The walk will provide an opportunity for families to experience the Christmas story together, where all the senses can absorb feelings of peace, calm and generosity.

Guests will meet in the decorated Family Life Center, receive a candle, and hear a short message about Christmas from Pastor Tim Philabaum. Timed for social distancing, families will then be dismissed to follow the Christmas Walk where Fontanini Nativity figures and accessories illustrate the events leading to the birth of Christ. The 12" figures were donated by the estate of Art and Norma White. Buildings for the set were built by Susan Hughes with other elements created by the Zoar Arts Committee. Favorite carols of the season will be provided by Omaldo Perez in the sanctuary. A small treat waits for children at the end of the walk which exits onto Sandusky Street. On some Sundays, horse and carriage rides around the block will be available.

The Sunday evening Christmas Candlelight Walk is free and open to the public. Zoar members may also enjoy the walk after church services; however, the full experience is better in the evening when candlelight is more effective. ## \$300 DEDUCTION AVAILABLE

For centuries Advent has been understood as a time of preparation and discovery. As we get ready for Christmas, we ready our homes, and more importantly, our hearts to welcome Jesus anew. During this year's preparations, we will do well to remember that Mary and Joseph were also readying themselves to travel in the weeks before Jesus' birth. The great Roman census was about to take place, and it was to include everyone in the Empire.

Regarding this context, theologian Thomas G. Long once wrote, "The writer of Luke is careful to remind us that the day of Jesus' birth was not a holy day, but a working day. Jesus was born not during a worship service but a tax census. The day when Jesus was born was a time, so to speak, of the ringing of cash registers, people standing in long lines to beat the deadline, snarled traffic, and crowds so thick that there was not a hotel room to be found."

Friends, as we go about our business and continue to live in uncertain times, perhaps preoccupied with what the future may hold, I pray that we may see this God who comes to us in the middle of the commotion and ordinariness of daily life. And let us be ready! Like Joseph and Mary, we too are bravely engaged in the most significant census of our lives: "We isolate ourselves so that when we can get back together, no one is missing."


