LET'S BUILD BEDS

Out in the countryside is a barn, replete with all sorts of wood-working tools and equipment. Gathered around the benches, using the drills and sanders, are men and women of Zoar and of the Perrysburg Exchange Club, using their gifts and care to build beds.

"Let's Build Beds" is an organization in Toledo that builds beds for youth who are sleeping on the floor. Their mission statement is: We believe that every child deserves a bed of their own to sleep in at night. We believe that every child is full of infinite potential. We help children by providing a bed & empowering them to assemble it and be successful. Lumber arrives and is cut, holes are made, and the wood is sanded and ready to be assembled.

What a great gift for the youth of Toledo! What a great ministry for Glen Abke and his cadre of wood-workers. At this point they have made almost 100 beds. Thank you!

"Let's Build Beds" is also in need of new sheets, blankets, and pillows. You may bring in these items to Zoar's Gathering Space, and we will make sure they are delivered to "Let's Build Beds."

FEED OUR FAMILIES CHRISTMAS

Weeks of planning, preparation, and gathering, led by Tracy Rickman, Brandy Bennington, Rhonda Jones, and their team, had come to fulfillment. On Saturday, December 11, 40 Volunteers arrived and were stationed. 35 families (about 95 children) came in throughout the day. They were appropriately distanced, while parents shopped for their children, children shopped for their parents, and families received several weeks' worth of food. So many items had been donated that boxes upon boxes of toys and gifts were then taken to Redeemer Lutheran for their Christmas giving. Wow!

Children were able to choose gifts for their parents that were then wrapped, so that the parents could open them on Christmas. In addition, a picture was taken of the children, so that they could make an ornament, or frame the picture. Dignity, joy, and respect were gifts that were also shared with all present. Truly, this was the hands of Jesus in action!

Feed Our Families began many summers ago to provide food for those families whose children, during the school year received a free or reduced lunch. During the pandemic, this gifted team has provided groceries every other week. This Christmas giving was the culmination of the ministry in this crazy Covid-2020. They will begin again in January – of course gifts of food or donations will be gratefully accepted.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The Gospel-writer John has recorded that Jesus prayed that, "they (His disciples) all be one." (John 17:11). History shows the reasons for all the divisions now present in the Church of Christ. But for many of us, the prayer continues that the Church see ourselves as One Church, full of diversity, but part of the family of Jesus.

A special week has been set aside to focus on this prayer. Beginning with The Confession of St. Peter (January 18 – see Matthew 16:16) through the Conversion of St. Paul (January 25 – see Acts 9) we uphold this truth in prayer.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is a "Full Communion Partner" with The Episcopal Church, the United Methodist Church, The Presbyterian Church, The Reformed Church in America, the United Church of Christ, and the Moravian Church. In this we share understandings of the Gospel and Church leadership. Pastors from one may serve in the other. With these there are special ways to celebrate our unity.

The ELCA also has a unique relationship with the Roman Catholic Church, having moved closer through the Joint Declaration on Justification by Grace through Faith, and other agreements. Other churches who share in Bi-lateral conversations include: The African Methodist Episcopal Church, the African Methodist Episcopal Church Zion, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), the Mennonite Church, and the Orthodox Church.

You are invited to use this week to center your prayer that all the Church may see as God see us – as united in our faith and witness. The "Day" will come when we will all see this truth together. Thanks be to God!

Like the Magi of old, we begin a new year paying attention to the signs around us, observing fortuitous alignments, and discovering how ancient wisdom speaks to the present moment. As an introspective endeavor, this exercise can be fruitful: it can spur our imaginations and invite further reflection.

January first is the date in whichfollowing the ancient Jewish tradition of naming boys on the date of their circumcision-we venerate the Name of Jesus and declare it a name above all names. 
