Yet, Covid continues, casting a pall over just about everything.



ADDITION TO COURTYARD

A colorful 5'-diameter tiled art piece has been installed as the final phase of the Zoar

Courtyard and was dedicated on Sunday, Sept 19. The art piece was designed by Annette Fink of Lourdes College based on drawings left by the late Jeri Madsen. The Madsen family donated money to implement and complete the project. Jeri's goals were to have something colorful and two-dimensional, that could be "touched". Her preliminary sketches included symbols from the Zoar sanctuary, as well as symbols representing the promise of the resurrection. The quatrefoil design around the perimeter of the piece represents the Trinity and can be found in the stained-glass windows, wooden ramp panes, altar and carpet in the sanctuary. Other symbols, such as the descending dove and waves of water represent the sacrament of baptism. The entire piece is anchored by the tree of life covered with hearts of love, with roots representing our foundation in Christ, as well as the deeply rooted history of Zoar in the life of the Perrysburg community. We are grateful to Annette Fink for her beautiful interpretation of Jeri's thoughts in this tile installation. The payment for Annette's labor on this project will be given to a local charity, per her request. The Courtyard Committee will make this determination in the near future. God shines a new light on us, where iniquities are forgiven and sins forgotten".

Friends, if there is something that we should never tire of remembering, is the truth about God's love for us. This gift is something worth remembering this and every season.

Current Procedures (as of October 1st, 2020):

Future Anticipated Return Strategy:

- Virtual Youth and Children's Sermon on Facebook will continue for those who cannot attend.
- Limit to specific grade level(s) on a Sunday (Grade rotations).
- Limit attendance to preregistration only and numbers that are obtainable with proper social distancing.
