## "And then..." BY CORY DRIVER

Even as the Gospels were being recorded, the Roman stranglehold on the Holy Land was tightening until Jewish revolts were put down with overwhelming force in 70 C.E. and 136 C.E. Thousands of people - men, women and children-were massacred by the proud and terrible invaders. Josephus relates that the Romans lined the walls of Jerusalem with thousands of crosses in 70 C.E. in order to crucify the 500 Jews captured daily (Jewish Wars, Chapter 11). The Christian community, which was hardly distinct from the Jewish community in the Holy Land, must have seen hundreds, if not thousands, of their siblings in Christ murdered in the same way as Jesus.

In the face of this terror, they recorded that even though they were scared, Mary, Mary and Salome went to share the good news that Jesus had risen from the dead. At a time when so many of their neighbors were being executed, the early Christians dared to hope, dream and believe that the empire

didn't have the final word, and that God was redeeming humanity from sin and death. Even in the darkest of times, when our friends and siblings are dying, when politics and rulers are unsettling and frightening, when prophecies are not being fulfilled (yet), our central claim remains that Jesus rose from the dead.

Would the Prince of Peace triumph over the power of the empire? Isaiah 25 argues that it will certainly happen! The Gospel of Mark doesn't say. What we know from Mark is that Jesus was raised from the dead. The powers of sin, death and the empire couldn't hold him. He wanted his disciples to know that he was going ahead of them. **And then** ....

The great hope of Jesus' resurrection isn't the end of the story, but the beginning of triumph of the kingdom of heaven over the forces of sin and death. We are blessed to be called into Jesus' victory and continue the story of what happens next.

Holy Week is one of my favorite church-times of the year. Yes, Christmas is awesome with its beauty and joy. But Holy Week brings together all the story that makes a difference in our lives. And, as this is my final Holy Week at Zoar, I am approaching it with great expectation.

So, walk with me. We take our cloaks and palm branches and join the crowds singing, "Hosanna to the Son of David.!" Thursday we take the steps up to the 2nd floor room. There Jesus takes on the task of the servant, washing our feet, and then, in the midst of the Passover Meal He takes the bread, gives thanks, blesses it, breaks it, and we eat, having heard Him say, "This is my body, given for you." Same with the wine. After the meal we head out to the Garden for prayer.

Into the late evening Jesus prays while we fall asleep. He keeps waking us, asking that we pray with him. Then, from the bottom of the hill, comes Judas with solders and officials. They arrest Jesus, and we, with the disciples, run away in fear.

Throughout the night Jesus is at the home of Caiaphas and Annas. The Jewish leaders try to pin blasphemy on him, and false witnesses speak out against him. By early morning he is taken to Pilate, the Roman Governor. One gospel writer notes that Jesus was sent by Pilate to Herod, who then sent Jesus back.

The solders mock him, beat him, whip him 39 times, place a crown of thorns on his head, and then by 9am he is taken to Calvary. Nails through his wrists and feet, he hangs until 3pm. To breathe he has to lift his body up by his hands and feet, with great pain. Most people ultimately die by suffocation at crucifixion. Darkness covers the land from Noon – 3pm. After his final "word" Jesus dies.

Friends and his mother take him down from the cross, place him in a borrowed tomb, and plan to come back on Sunday to finish the burial process.

But here's the twist – he isn't there on Sunday. He has risen! Not only Good News, but Great News! He meets with disciples at different times for the next forty days. Death is destroyed, and the new age has come.

Blessings, brothers and sisters, in this week and in the years ahead. All of this comes out of God's great love for you and for all creation. We are truly blessed!

# **GATHER/GROW/GIVE**


The ELCA provides daily prayer ventures for each month of the year. From the ELCA:

### Confirmation




