Every time we worship, we practice greeting as Christ does—with love, grace and welcoming arms. Living the liturgy daily means we can teach our kids to meet, greet and welcome as Christ does, seeing everyone as a beloved child of God.

PRACTICES

*Take a walk around your neighborhood and stop to talk with people. Ask them how they are doing and if they have anything you could hold in prayer for them.

*In worship (whether in person or online) listen for the greeting offered by the pastor. When it's your turn to respond with "And also with you," extend your arms with palms up to physically express the greeting.
*Leave greetings of hope and love in random places for people to find. As a family, write your own greetings (God loves you, Christ be with you, Peace be with you) and leave them on porches, on park benches or at a table in a restaurant.

PRAYERS

We pray for neighborhoods, that they may be safe and welcoming.
We pray for summer camps and vacation Bible school programs.
We pray for friends near and far who need a word of encouragement.
We give thanks for water that nourishes our plants and helps crops grow.
We give thanks for conversations with friends and neighbors.

We give thanks for worship opportunities both inside and outside the church.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer. Amen.

SERVICE OPPORTUNITY

As more and more places open in the coming months, see if your family can volunteer at a group home or nursing home to take a walk with residents. After months of limited visitors, they may appreciate the chance to tell stories and be outside greeting others.

RETURN FROM COVID

A Report from Doug Williams, member of the Back-Again Committee

Where we have come from:

As the pandemic of 2020 set on the world, we at Zoar have been following guidelines set out by the ELCA, CDC and gov't officials to keep everyone as safe as possible

- Early on, we eliminated Face-to-Face meeting and use of the Church facilities
- After several weeks and a better understanding, we returned to In-Worship in the FLC with strict guidelines:
 - Correctly worn Face Coverings
 - •Temperature Checks
 - Social Distancing
 - Sanitizing touch points between each service

What we now understand

- The steering committee has been looking for direct guidance and has been having difficulty finding such directive, but we are now under the general understanding:
 - COVID-19 is a more aerosol transmitted disease than a touch point transmission.
 - That Vaccinations aid in stopping the spread of COVID
 - Hand Sanitizing and Hand Washing are more important than Touch Point Sanitizing (however, still important)
- Use of Face Covering and Social Distancing continue to be a priority to aid in the elimination of spreading COVID

Our present guidelines

- You may enter from Parking lot though glass doors or from Sandusky St entrance
- •There will be areas to acknowledge your presence at church by signing in or texting in(no red pew pad usage)
- Recommended masking at all times in facilities
- Use hand sanitizer often
- Continue to use printed bulletin (no hymnal uses)
- Continue with Social Distancing with blocked off pews
 - Rotate used pews each service
- Prefer to exit out Rear of church (main doors) and down steps to keep flow in one door and out the other
 - Ramp and elevator still available for the few who need such
- Exit building and gather outdoors to allow the sanitizing that needs to take place between services.

By following these guidelines, we feel we are maintaining a safe worship environment and allow us to get back into the sanctuary for those who feel comfortable in the face-to-face worship.

With these new guidelines, we are in need of WEEKLY sanitizing coordinators at each service.

- Responsibilities following services would be:
 - Take a count and record the total number in attendance during the church service (each heartbeat) including Pastors, Organist and other lay-assistances
 - Change out Attendance Sheets
 - Change blocked off pews

If you are such a person to help us during these times, please reach out to Suzanne in the church office to be added to our list.



WORSHIP IN JUNE

Logos ("the word" in Greek) is the name John uses in his gospel to introduce Christ. "In the beginning was the Word." This expression somehow implies order. The connection is apparent to anyone untrained in biblical Greek when one realizes that the modern terms "logic" and "logical" share the same source with Logos. Logos suggests something accessible to the mind, intelligible.

Speaking of understanding, you may wonder why during worship—week after week we revisit Jesus' life and teachings. As it turns out, it is in the careful exposition of these episodes (as presented by the homilist, amplified by the singing congregation, and embodied by all in our liturgies) that we Christians "make sense" of God.

We study the bible and proclaim the gospel because we believe Christ is God's self-revelation. The task of interpreting scripture (in proclamation and preaching) performed in the gathered assembly is one of the many life-sustaining gifts of the Holy Spirit for the faithful community. Through the careful exposition of scripture and the vigorous participation of the assembly in worship, we hope to catch a (new) glimpse of this self-disclosing God.

I trust you may find useful these thoughts by biblical scholar Gail Ramshaw as we prepare to inwardly digest the gospel this month.

JUNE 5/6 LECTIONARY 10

Mark's narratives proclaim that Jesus' power comes, not from evil, but from God, for good. We are now those who become Jesus' mother, brothers, and sisters as we hear the word, share the meal, and enact God's will in the world. Mark 3:20-35 seems to be asking, "What is the power upon which we rely?"

JUNE 12/13 LECTIONARY 11

With the mustard seed parable, Mark is not presenting the stereotypical image of the small-become-great. Instead, in Christ's cross and resurrection, what looks to the world like an annual bush, is recognized by believers as the cosmic tree of life. We discover the good news hidden in parables, hidden in the cross, the bread, and the wine.

JUNE 19/20 LECTIONARY 12

We continue going through Mark's proclamation of Christ. We encounter in today's gospel that it is we who are in the "other boats." We are called to faith in God, who, hidden in Christ, is the creator of the earth who conquers our demons.

JUNE 26/27 LECTIONARY 13

Christians interpret miracles as an in-breaking of the future resurrection into this world and time. Today's double narrative (as found in Mark 5:21-43) includes several signs of Jesus' earth-shattering ministry: Jesus ministers to a Jew outside his circle; he welcomes the petition of a religiously unclean woman; he touches a dead body. Yet his identity remains a secret to many. We, too, are bleeding our life away; we too are lying dead. At worship, we are healed by contact with the risen Christ.

Now bold to serve him, now cheered his love to own, never alone.

Up, weak knees and spirit bowed in sorrow! No tomorrow shall arise to beat you down;

God goes before you and angels all around; on your head a crown!

Amen! And may we continue to grow and prosper confident in this knowledge!


Zoar Vacation Bible School 2021


