Looking at the 'long now' BY ELISE SEYFRIED

"He brought him outside and said, 'Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.'" (Genesis 15:5).

I remember first reading the verse above, then going outside to look at the starry night sky. I imagined the Lord's conversation with Abram under that very same sky, and God's promise that Abram's descendants would be too numerous to count.

In the thousands of years since, those descendants have indeed numbered in the billions, including me. But then I look ahead, to Abram's descendants still to come. I realize that I too am their ancestor, and that realization fills me with sadness. What am I leaving for my children's children? Even as a person of faith, I sometimes wonder if there's reason to be hopeful about the future. But after learning about the 10,000 Year Clock and speaking with a prominent Lutheran theologian, I anticipate the future with optimism. Inventor Danny Hillis wanted to build something that would last as far into the future as human life extends into the past (approximately 10,000 years).

So, at night, whether we stand atop a mountain in the desert or in our own backyards, we can look up at the multitude of stars and give thanks for the exciting possibilities ahead, for us and for our descendants—possibilities we can help make realities. Our Adventum future with our loving God can be as bright as the night sky and as beautiful as the chimes of an incredible clock. Let us plant our acorns now, so that someday there will be majestic oaks. We have the vision, the resources and, with God's help, the will to make the next 10,000 years glorious.



Grace, Mercy, and Peace from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

This scene from the Book of Ezra takes place as the foundations of the new second Temple are finished and dedicated. The first Temple, the Temple of Solomon, had been destroyed along with the city of Jerusalem decades before and so there had been no worship or sacrifice. Then, after years of prayer and work, the foundations of the Temple are laid. And the people have lots of feelings. While some of the people are celebrating because the Lord has provided a way to return to living out covenant worship, others are weeping because they can so easily see what has been lost and what a long road is ahead of them.

As difficult as it may be to believe, as of your reading this article, the time for PastorTim to retire is coming up this week. After decades of service to the Lord in the ministry of Word and Sacrament, most of that time here at Zoar, and after a more than year long pandemic-caused delay, the date of Tim's retirement is here. And many will be weeping at the loss of his presence in leadership here after so many years, some may be quietly lifting shouts of joy. And while many people at Zoar have gone out of their way to be welcoming to me as the still pretty new pastor; certainly, some are weeping that I'm not PastorTim.

But isn't that way in many things in life. We come to these events with our perspectives and our understandings, and those so often shape our response more than the event itself! Even with things that everyone is going through like the pandemic. Even amid the sorrows of loss and limitations, there have been joys of more close time with immediate family and a more focused recognition of our need to care for one another.

The returning children of Israel knew that whether they were among those weeping or among those shouting for joy the God who had claimed them was with them. And whether we find ourselves in joys or sorrows, no matter what event has brought those feelings to us, our Lord Jesus Christ is with us. Because of his life, death, and resurrection for the sake of the world, Jesus is able to assure his disciples that he is with them always. And by God's amaZing grace, Jesus Christ is with us always too. Jesus with us through the years of Pastor Tim's leadership; Jesus with us at Pastor Tim's retirement; Jesus with us as we move into the future where he is also, calling us forward to share God's grace with the world.

So, in our weeping, in our shouts of joy and everything inbetween, Jesus Christ goes with us.

WORSHIP IN SEPTEMBER

We begin the month by celebrating Pastor Tim's thirty-six-year ministry at Zoar. On the fourth, Zoar will have a party in the parking lot at seven p.m., but we will continue with our farewells and best wishes for Pastor Tim on Sunday. On Saturday 9/11 (at the six o'clock service), Zoar will hold a service of mourning and lament marking the tragedy of the 2,996 lives lost twenty years ago, the nearly 610,000 lives lost in the last eighteen months, as well as the social and racial inequities that grip our country. On Sunday, 9/12, we get back on year B's saddle: Peter's confession; the following weekend, we hear about the paradoxical nature of Christian discipleship: it is by being humble that we can achieve greatness. Finally, on the last weekend of the month, we are admonished to work for peace and to stop trying to get in the way of God's work in the world.

SEPTEMBER 4/5 – Celebration of Ministry and Farewells

PastorTim has hand-picked the readings and hymns for this memorable weekend. For our services, we will sing the liturgical setting by Steven Janco, the Mass of Angels and Saints, as well as several hymns connected to his life in ministry and reflective of our shared journey and mission. Lord, Whose Love in Humble Service (ELW 712), PastorTim's ordination hymn, will be the vehicle through which we, the congregation, proclaim the Gospel.

SEPTEMBER 11/12 – Service of Lament/Peter's Confession

The readings on Sunday come to us in the form of admonitions: The prophet Isaiah calls himself a teacher, one whose words sustain weary people. James warns about the foolish and hurtful use of our tongues, which often are used to "curse those who are made in the likeness of God." Finally, Jesus keeps the disciples quiet about his identity, and speaks openly about his own suffering, death, and resurrection. Peter tries to counsel Jesus, but Jesus responds that Peter has lost sight of what is most important in life and teaches the disciples that they will lose their life for the sake of the gospel. These selections refer only to Sunday since we will hold a stand-alone service of lament on Saturday.

SEPTEMBER 18/19 – Jesus predicts his passion

Of this Sunday's gospel, Gail Ramshaw writes: "Jesus keeps describing what is going to happen to him, but his followers can't understand and don't want to understand. So instead, they argue about who is greatest. Putting a quick end to that line of argument, Jesus brings a child into their circle. Embracing the child, Jesus invites disciples into humble service—this is how we draw near to God and God to us." All are Welcome (ELW 641) will be our Hymn of the Day.

SEPTEMBER 25/26 – Jesus warns those who obstruct faith

In Mark 9:38-50, the disciples—at least John—are upset because they saw somebody, not a disciple, "casting out demons" in Jesus' name. Scholars like to point out how "John sounds like the Pharisees, who became upset when someone out of their control, Jesus, healed a person on the sabbath (Mark 3:1-6)." The words of our hymn of the day, "Keep me from saying words that later need recalling; guard me, lest idle speech may from my lips be falling" (O God, My Faithful God ELW 806 St. 3), will echo the Gospel's themes.
