

## **Feed Our Families**

### **ZOAR COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

Zoar's Feed Our Families program provides groceries to families living in Northern Wood County with schoolaged children who qualify for free or reduced school lunches. The program runs during the summer to help offset a family's need for food while children are home from school. This



year, Feed Our Families, begins Thursday, June 9, and continues every other Thursday through August 4.

The way the program works is that Zoar volunteers stock the Family Life Center (FLC) like a grocery store for people to shop with shopping carts to gather groceries for their family. This setup allows for a more comfortable experience empowering those who use it and to help break the stigmas of food bank use. "Most years, we serve between 30-45 families," said Tracy Rickman, chair of the Feed Our Families program. "However, I believe we will see a greater need this year because of the higher cost of food and toiletries in general."



COVID completely shifted operations for food assistance and now supply chain shortages are threatening food banks. "We're working through some issues with food shortages and delivery," said Tracy. "While we won't know the extent of our needs until our transport

issue is resolved, one thing we always need is deodorant and toiletries. Donated items can be left in the cabinets marked Feed Our Families near the Gathering Space area."

We are also in need of youth and adult volunteers who can lift and carry 10+ pounds," continued Tracy. "But we won't ever turn anyone away who will help."

### **WORSHIP IN JUNE**

### JUNE 5: PENTECOST SUNDAY: CHANGE AND GOD'S PEACE

Some ancient philosophers argued about the true nature of things. One Heraclitus of Ephesus proposed that the world is made of fire. Perhaps not in the literal sense, but as a metaphor for life's changing and transitory nature. As we celebrate Pentecost and God in the third person of the Trinity, we remember the Holy Spirit showed up as fire—and fire as God's manifestation in the world. Regarding change, Jesus promised: "But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. 27Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." On Pentecost, we remain open for (and recommit ourselves to) God's marvelous work. How are we living into the gift of God's presence? How is this gift opening possibilities in our lives?

#### JUNE 12: HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY: RELATIONSHIP MODEL

This festival, the only one in our calendar dedicated to a doctrine, invites us to consider how God (one divine unity of three distinct presences) is constituted or characterized by relationship. Church Fathers imagined the divine interdependence as a "dance around" (from the Greek "perichoresis"): of the Father with the Son, the Son with the Spirit. This interdependence is a model of community for Christians. Following this model, the Christian community bases its decisions and actions on God's graceful co-inherence or "indwelling." Therefore, in everything we do, let us be mindful of each other. "Holy, Holy, Holy, God Lord Almighty is a perfect hymn to praise God and explore our "loving coordination" as members of the body of Christ.

#### JUNE 19: LECTIONARY 12: LETTING EVERYONE KNOW

After a few weeks of John, our lectionary finally brings us back to Luke, and this Sunday, we get to hear one of the great healing stories of the New Testament, that of the Gerasene demoniac, Here, we encounter one of the most notable reversals of fortune for both human and non-human participants. Even when we know that in the world of ancient Israel, pigs were considered "unclean," it is difficult for us to hear this story and not relate to their fate. The pigs were minding their own business when a horde of demons suddenly took possession of them and led them to their doom. More dramatic still was the witness of the man who was enslaved by his condition for years. Jesus commissioned the Gerasene to be a witness to the liberation: "Return to your home and declare how much God has done for you." We, disciples of Jesus, should do well to follow this admonition. Let us keep stock of the many blessing in our daily lives.

### **JUNE 26: LECTIONARY 13: EXCUSES**

In today's episode of the Gospel, we see a pattern. The pattern goes like this: when Jesus invites individuals to follow him, the answer invariably is: "Yes, but...X." The "X" is perceived by some as the priority that delays the response of the would-be disciple. Discipleship is not easy. Humans (then and now) are in the habit of presenting all sorts of excuses for why we can't start right away. But Jesus insists; he keeps calling and wants a straight answer now. He makes it clear that answering his call and living the life of discipleship requires no less than everything. No wonder there is resistance to the radical call of discipleship. Yet, we are also reminded that the Spirit will support our work and, in turn, give us the strength and all resources to answer the call.
