The Very Presence of Christ in this Place

As of March 27, the United Nations estimates that 275,439 Ukrainian refugees have crossed the border into Slovakia. Drahus Oslik knows that border well.

A pastor of Evangelical Lutheran in Waynesboro, Pa., Oslik has been given a two-week humanitarian leave by the congregation council to travel to his native Slovakia, where he is providing pastoral counseling and translation services to war refugees at the border with Ukraine.

Evangelical Lutheran Church in Partizánska Ľupča, a small town in northern Slovakia, currently houses 82 Ukrainian refugees, Oslik said some in its parsonage but most in members' homes. He remembers the congregation's pastor, Jan Molcan, telling him, "These times are the test of our faith. Now we'll be able to see whether we'll live through our deeds and what we say with our lips. Many do—they are here to help their brothers and sisters in need."

"I am inspired by what I have seen," Oslik said. "The most beautiful people—the brave and courageous Ukrainians, whose stories are too many to share—and the caring and selfless volunteers, working nonstop to take care of the most vulnerable before them."

These people are the very presence of Christ in this place," he continued. "I'm humbled by the incredible love, cheerful spirit, hard work and selflessness to which I am bearing witness."

Following JESUS DAILY

Grace and peace from God our Father, and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

"When (Jesus) had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, 'Do you have anything here to eat?'" Luke 24:40-41

Easter services are always a joy. The sanctuary is full of people: regular attenders, infrequent attenders and visitors. Special decorations, special music and an air of anticipation all come together to lift us up, out of ourselves to catch a glimpse of the Lord who loves us so much that he went through suffering, crucifixion, death and resurrection for our sakes. The angels announce, the disciples are transformed from terror to disbelieving joy and the gates of heaven are opened to all believers because (is everybody ready?) **Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! Amen!**

And like the disciples, sometimes it takes a bit for us to get there. Maybe it's the tiredness of getting up early to come to the sunrise service; maybe it's the lack of familiarity with all the folks who aren't usually sitting around us; or maybe it's that without so many surrounding things like we have at Christmastime (lights, trees, carols, cookies, snow, wreaths, etc.) we just have a tougher time grabbing ahold of the mood. But we usually get there. Seeing (and smelling) the flowers, hearing some Easter Hymns (Jesus Christ is risen today...), hearing all the children; whatever it is for each one of us, we find an, "Ahh, it's Easter" moment. For the disciples it was Jesus eating a fish sandwich, which sounds more like Good Friday at the K of C hall to me, but it's different for everybody.

But then what? After the last service, after all the flowers are taken out, after the Easter dishes are just leftovers in the fridge and the rest of life comes knocking on Monday morning. Was that it? A nice sort of happy feeling that we hope to find each first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox? (That really is the formula for when Easter Sunday falls!) Or, to appropriate Dr. Seuss, it's Easter, perhaps just a little bit more?

Really, it's A LOT more! The Good News of Christ's Resurrection changes everything. Christ has conquered sin and death for us, so we no longer need to live in fear that one misstep will blow our chances to see heaven. No more panic that we aren't good enough for God; we <u>aren't</u> good enough, but Christ is, and Christ has claimed us. The real question for us each to ponder is, "How do I respond to the Grace of God shown to me in the love of Jesus?" I don't believe there is one answer, but I do believe <u>that</u> is the right question to wrestle with and to try to live that out as Christ's Easter people each day.

I love a good Easter worship service! I love following Jesus daily, more. Peace,

WORSHIP IN MAY

After April, we continue to luxuriate in the Easter season and celebrate God's wonderful gift of salvation. Gail Ramshaw explores these intersections in the following synopses, which have been adapted for our use.

MAY 1, EASTER III: DO YOU LOVE ME? FOLLOW ME

When we encounter Jesus, we are changed and will never be the same. Jesus can be revealed in the blinding light, in an abundance of fish, in breakfast on the beach. God uses all sorts of surprising things – bread, wine, water, words of forgiveness – to convert us. Like baptism, this conversion is both a once-in-a-lifetime, life-changing event and a daily process – a change that comes again and again, like Jesus' question to Peter: "Do you love me?" Again and again, Jesus calls us to follow him. Conversion sets each of them and us on a path that continues for the rest of our life on earth and leads us into eternal life.

MAY 8, EASTER IV: THE SEARCHING SHEEP

As the church, we have grown accustomed to the idea of Jesus seeking out the lost sheep and bringing them safely home – of knowing the sheep intimately by name. Today's texts are rich in reframing who is searching for whom. In this season of proclaiming a Christ who breaks the powers of death and whose realm is one of glory, we open ourselves to questions of exactly who this Jesus is – and see answers coming to life in story, miracles, and testimony. Today is an opportunity for us in weakness and glory, doubt and faith, simplicity and awe to seek and embrace the one who is already in our midst.

MAY 15, EASTER V: GOD'S BEAUTIFULLY MESSY COMMUNITY

Through the depth of the day's texts, people are invited to explore the beauty and the messiness of community. Like any other human organization, the church is filled with the challenges of what it means to live together (for example, who is welcome? What rules do people need to follow? How do we care for one another?). However, unlike other human institutions, we are called to be centered and re-centered in the unapologetic love for others. In our imperfection, we are welcomed and called to invite others.

MAY 22, EASTER VI: OUR HOME-MAKING GOD

Jesus promises that though he is going away, he will come to his disciples in the power of an advocate, the Holy Spirit and that he and the Father will make their home in all who believe. The gathering of the faithful assembly to receive Christ's word and sacrament is a foretaste of that New Jerusalem, where God will finally and ultimately be at home with us, even as the Holy Trinity makes a home now in the hearts of all who believe. Into the anxieties and uncertainties of life, we are offered a vision of a glorious future--when God will be at home with us, and we will be at home with God – a living foretaste of that same future: "We will come to them and make our home with them... Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

MAY 29, EASTER VII: PRAYING FOR YOU

Today's gospel reading is, first and foremost, a prayer. It is Jesus' prayer, and we are given the privilege of listening in as he prays on behalf of his disciples and people of all times and places. Here is the astoundingly good news: Jesus prays for you and the communities in which we find ourselves. Whether your cup is empty or full, whether your community is in crisis or experiencing joy, Jesus loves you deeply, and your life is bound to the God who loved you before the foundations of the world. On the eve of his death, Jesus entrusted your life, and the church's, to the Father. What glorious good news that the future rests in the care of the Triune God and that we, the church, are set free to make God known to the world!

We are living! / Spread the word of grace abroad."

Dear Friends, there is so much for which to be thankful! May we continue to grow in peace, joy, and gratitude sure in the knowledge of Jesus' resurrection.
