That's how I begin most every visit I make with Zoar's nearly 40 homebound members. And they all have stories! After our conversation, we transition to worship and Holy Communion. As I leave them, after about an hour's visit, they invariably tell me how much our time together meant to them.

I'm pleased that the congregation values our older members...enough to provide for their spiritual welfare when they can no longer attend worship because of age or impairment. Some of these folks have served on Council, taught Sunday School, served funeral luncheons, or did other important volunteer ministries. One gentleman showed me the usher's guidebook he received back in the 1940's and reminded me of the day long gone when ushers had

to remember where folks sat, and then personally escort them to their pew and hand them a bulletin!

The challenge for all churches today is to look to the future and plan ministries that invite and welcome new people. This is essential if the church is to thrive.

At the same time, churches need to be attentive to the needs of those who attend and participate in our ministries. They, too, have their stories, and they need to be heard.

But, we also treasure our homebound members, and those who live in congregate housing in the community and seldom (if ever) attend worship services. They remain important members of the Zoar family.

Thank you for inviting me into this ministry! And I thank Pastor Paul Reichert and his staff for their warm welcome and collegial support.

of God's kingdom breaking in is mentioned long before Paul. Psalm 19 calls the decrees of the Lord more precious than gold and sweeter than honey. Isaiah 25 speaks of God providing a feast of rich food for all people who put their trust in the Lord. But I think Paul is talking about something more.

Paul isn't specifically talking about the rich blessing of the message of Christ; the good news that Jesus Christ, the eternal Son, was born in a stable in Bethlehem, grew and lived and taught, did signs and wonders revealing God's kingdom; the message of Jesus who suffered and died on a cross, was buried and rose again for our hope and redemption. Paul is writing to the church in Colossae who already knows the Good News. Paul says, "let the message of Christ dwell in you richly..."

A lot of times, we think about the Gospel the same way we think about rich food. It's wonderful and amazing and best in really small doses. You wouldn't have a piled plate of caviar or big old bowl of black truffles. But Jesus Christ didn't die and rise for you so that you could have a sip of salvation; Jesus didn't send the Holy Spirit so you could have a few hours a week or month or year of hope. Jesus gave his life and rose that you might have abundant life, a life packed full of the hope of salvation; so that, the Good News would so fill and overflow your life that you couldn't help but have people notice. In that way, it is like a great garlic packed Italian meal, you know, and those around you know, for days as that garlic works through even your sweat.

That's what Christ wants. For you to be so full, so indwelt richly, with the promise, comfort and joy of the Gospel that wherever you are and whatever you do, people can't help but know the amazing love of God reflected in your life. Don't limit yourself to a taste of salvation. Grow in faith; grow in giving; grow in celebrating being part of the Body of Christ. Let the love of Jesus Christ fill your life to overflowing.

Worship and Music – It's about Faith!

October has been the month of frost, with a killing frost in our area more likely around the third week. Leaves turn color; some fall. Harvesting of corn and soybeans begins. We know this time of the year as we know the other seasons. We know what to expect. Many of you know what to expect in our services this month as well. Knowing what to expect is a matter of faith.

We continue in liturgical autumn throughout this month. We hear about mustard seeds, faith and obligation, about persistence in the face of injustice, about humility in all that we do. We do what God calls us to do, trusting and expecting that God brings some good out of our doing. You have heard it said that the good we do is not our doing, but God working through us. This is our faith.

This October 8-9 you may hear that God has done good through Dietrich Bonhoeffer, teacher, martyr, 1945. This is six months after his official day of commemoration which is April 9. But this is when Bonhoeffer scholar Rev. Mark Brocker of St. Andrew Lutheran Church, Beaverton, Oregon, will be with us. Mark earned a Ph.D. in Theology (University of Chicago Divinity School). His dissertation is entitled "The Community of God, Jesus Christ, and Responsibility: The Responsible Person and the Responsible Community in the Ethics of Dietrich Bonhoeffer." Whoa! You really wanted to know that; didn't you? He really is a Bonhoeffer scholar. He is delightful in conversation. And he has a small Ohio connection: his dad was a seminarian intern at St. John's Lutheran in Fremont.

Saturday, October 8 at 10:00 a.m. is Rev. Brocker's presentation "Embracing the Fullness of life." His sermon at all services is "A Miracle of Divine Mercy." Sunday, October 9 at 9:45 a.m. is an adult forum "What Does It Mean to Tell the Truth?"

On October 29-30 you know what to expect: Reformation Sunday. It's about faith.


