we look back over the year that it has been, for the blessings we have received, for the strength to endure hardships and griefs, and for the joys that have enriched our lives.

In that way, we echo the genesis of our national Thanksgiving holiday. By remembering the Plymouth pilgrims who endured so much and were thankful for their new Native American friends and the bountiful harvest that would carry them through the next winter. And their thankfulness was not simply a feeling of general gratitude but a prayer of thanksgiving to God who had blessed them so abundantly; a gratitude they felt all the more keenly after having been through such difficult times.

It would be easy to stop there – to be appropriately grateful to the source of every blessing. But as we look to the scriptures in both the Old and New Testaments we see story after story of a God who keeps caring even when we turn away or forget. Zoar Youth — Center for Youth Ministry Training

Sometimes we feel a nudge by the Holy Spirit. Sometimes there's a "God wink" that you can't help but notice. That has happened. For the past few months, members of the Life Long Learning and Youth and Young Adult Committees have been exploring possibilities and data about our young people within Zoar Lutheran Church. While at the same time, filling important roles as Sunday School leaders and reshaping Catechism to better meet the needs of our students and families. In the course of all this, one thing remains clear... Zoar Lutheran's children, youth and young adults need staff devoted to engage with them, form and build their faith and equip them to lead.

Here's where the "God wink" comes into play. We have learned about CYMT – four letters that until recently we hadn't heard of together. They stand for the Center for Youth Ministry Training. An organization that equips youth ministers and communities of faith to develop innovate, effective and theologically informed ministries so youth may experience the love and grace of Jesus Christ.

CYMT partners with congregations and individuals representing the theological views and diversity of mainline Protestant Christianity. They partner with the United Methodist Church, Presbyterian, Cumberland Presbyterian, ELCA Lutheran, Episcopal, Disciples of Christ, American Baptist and Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary is their theological partner. Zoar Lutheran has applied to be a partner in their Ministry Program to equip Zoar with up to two graduates in residences who are pursuing their Master of Arts degree in Youth Ministry. More to come. For now, we invite your fervent prayers for where God may be leading us to staff our children, youth and young adult ministries. Watch for an Adult Forum on Sunday, November 6 to learn more! Worship & Music—Living the End and the Beginning

Did you know that November only has three Sundays this year? What? No, I haven't misread the calendar. But in the liturgical calendar three Sundays in November bring us to the end of the church year, a Day of Thanksgiving intervenes, and then comes the First Sunday in Advent, the beginning of a new church year. The calendar and its appointed readings reflect the ends and the beginnings we live through as individuals, as families, as congregations or as the whole assembly of the people of God.

Three times in Lectionary Year C, our present year, Jesus proclaims, "I am the Alpha and the Omega...." These are readings from Revelation on the 2nd, 5th and 7th Sundays of Easter. You know what words you expect to follow: "...the beginning and the end." The language varies a bit, but the meaning is just that. Check it out in Revelation 1:8, Revelation 21:6 and Revelation 22:13.

Now, however, we are at the end of the year, and our lives are turned around. Now we live the end and the beginning, for "... [God] is not God of the dead, but of the living" In our readings we hear about death (Luke 20:27-38) and destruction (Luke 21:5-19) and crucifixion (Luke23:33-43), about living the end of life to awake in Advent (Matthew 24:36-44). We are living the end and the beginning. If you have a copy of Evangelical Lutheran Worship at home or have time to look at church, check hymn 780, Marty Haugen's hymn paraphrase of Psalm 23, Shepherd Me, O God, as the refrain carries out this theme, "from death into life."

What the Bible doesn't tell us about them is that they were most likely the caregivers of their brother. They took care of him during his illnesses. They did what so many of you do for those you love. They gave up a portion of their time, and expended no small amount of energy, to make their brother comfortable when he was unable to care for himself.

I mention this for two reasons. First, as I meet with many of our older members (and a few notso-old), I hear stories of illnesses and injury, and powerful stories of family members and friends

who have been like Mary and Martha in caring for them. Praise God for such sacrificial love! And praise and thanks to the caregivers themselves, who choose to become loving servants, as Christ calls us to be for each other.

Second, I mention a particular caregiver whom I have benefited from these past few weeks, my wife, Sue! You may know that I had a second knee replacement August 1, and while I am slowly healing, there were complications. A blood clot behind the knee, and an infection in my body made recovery slower than expected. But I am on the mend...thanks in large part to the ministrations of my wife. She jokingly reminds me that I owe her, big time...and I do!

So, who are the caregivers in your life? Who has sacrificed to help you heal? Have you thanked them? I'm sure you have!

And if you are a caregiver, putting the needs of a family member or friend ahead of your own plans, to you I say thanks! Thank you for being like Mary and Martha. Thanks for making God's love and care concrete in another person's life. This is your ministry, your mission right now. Thanks be to God!

- Arches used to enclose the altar area, whereas it's now a much more open space.
- The reredos was down near the altar and now it's hung high above in the sanctuary.
- Baptismal font was in the center, now it's to the right.
- Choir was seated to the left of the altar, now they are centered behind it.
- Organ was to the right of altar, now it's on the left.


