While Advent is a season of hope and Christmas is a season of joy, not everyone feels hopeful or likes celebrating. To provide a time and place of solace during the often frenetic days surrounding the celebration of Christmas, Zoar will hold a Blue Christmas service on Sunday, December 18 at 2PM. We come together seeking healing and room to share grief, sadness, loneliness, or confusion when these emotions often feel out of place during the holidays.

Christmas IS A CELEBRATION

As I write this, we are starting to get ready for our big family Thanksgiving. It's a significant task because we are having somewhere between 20 and 30 people. There is cleaning, arranging, decorating and, of course, the cooking. People put so much pressure on themselves about Thanksgiving dinner that there are hotlines to call! And after Thanksgiving, we jump straight into preparing for Christmas. Truth be told, I have seen more than a few folks taking advantage of the warm weather we have had this November to put up their Christmas decorations already. And not only put them up, but light them to start enjoying them already. But not so many people decorate for Thanksgiving at the beginning of October. So what's the difference?

Both Thanksgiving and Christmas often have large family dinners. Both of those require cleaning, decoration and preparation. Both often feature a meal of foods that connect us to family traditions sometimes reaching back many generations. Both draw people together. But, in many ways, the similarities end there.

Getting ready for Thanksgiving has to happen in the midst of everything else. Christmas has a whole season, Advent, which helps us focus on preparing not only our homes but our hearts as well. While the meal is important for Christmas, and families want it to be just so, it rarely reaches the fever-pitch of Thanksgiving dinner prep because Christmas is more than a dinner. For Thanksgiving, some may gather together for a worship service; some may sing one of the harvest home songs; some may gather for the traditional after dinner football game nap. But at its heart, Thanksgiving is centered around the meal.

And yes, because Christmas comes in winter here in the Northern Hemisphere, it is often tied to winter festival themes, but even those are transformed by Christ. We light lights not against the growing darkness nor to encourage the sun to return; instead, we light our homes in celebration that the light of the Son has already broken into the darkness of this world. People who rarely make it to worship are drawn by the grace of God on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to come and worship the newborn king born in Bethlehem who would go on to give his life on the cross and rise on Easter. We worship the God whose love for us is so great that, "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory of the Father's only begotten Son, full of grace and truth."

At its heart, Thanksgiving is a celebration that we do; even when we remember to be thankful to the Lord. At its heart, Christmas is a celebration of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. And it makes all the difference.

Here's my take on seniors and the holidays: Don't worry or stress. They'll appreciate it!
